

Ike To Hold Political Conference

DENVER (AP)—President Eisenhower arranged another political conference today to receive a report on a phase of the Republican campaign to keep control of Congress.

Starting the final week of his Colorado work-and-play vacation, the President scheduled a meeting with Sen. Frank Barrett, Wyoming Republican.

From Barrett, Eisenhower was to get the latest word on the campaign progress of the party's candidate for the U. S. Senate from Wyoming, Rep. William Henry Harrison.

Former Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney, defeated by Barrett in 1952, is Harrison's Democratic opponent in a close race.

Full details on Eisenhower's plans to step up his personal campaign for election of another GOP-led Congress in November may be disclosed at the Denver White House this week.

He plans a farm speech somewhere in the Midwest, possibly in Illinois or Indiana, and another major campaign address in the Washington area, but there has been no official announcement on the place or date of either talk. His final address of the campaign will be a "get out the vote" speech election eve, Nov. 1, probably from Washington.

Murray Snyder, White House press secretary, said the reaction of the public and GOP leaders to the President's nationwide television-radio address Friday night continues to be "generally very favorable."

In that speech, Eisenhower envisioned a "cold war of partisan politics" breaking out in Washington if the Democrats recapture control of Congress.

In reply, Sen. Lyndon Johnson and Rep. Sam Rayburn, Texas Democrats who lead the minority party in the Senate and House, telegraphed the President. "It takes two belligerents to make a war, and therefore there will be none unless it is initiated by the executive branch."

Indications are the President will return to Washington Friday.

Red Stand On U.N. Arms Plan Asked

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Britain's Selwyn Lloyd Monday called upon Russia for an early statement clarifying just how far the Kremlin is prepared to go in meeting Western conditions for arms reduction and atomic control.

The British minister of state said Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky had given some reason for hope in his new proposals 10 days ago, but had left many vital questions unanswered.

Lloyd was the first speaker in the disarmament debate before the General Assembly's 60-nation Political Committee. He was followed by French Delegate Jules Moch who also appealed for clarification of the Soviet position.

Lloyd specifically asked Vishinsky to state in plain terms whether Russia is now ready to accept an ironclad international inspection system which would be in

operation before an arms reduction or atomic ban was put into effect.

Until such clarification is forthcoming, he said, "we must be careful to be neither too pessimistic nor too optimistic."

"We must be careful not to raise false hopes," he continued. "We must not give the impression that solutions . . . are easy to achieve or near at hand."

Lloyd said that even the most optimistic estimates fix 12 months

as the minimum time for drafting a convention on inspection and control.

Both Lloyd and Moch dealt at length with the new Soviet proposals and a British-French formula, put forward last June and

later accepted in principle by the United States. The two plans appear to have many points in common.

The political committee debate is expected to continue about two weeks.

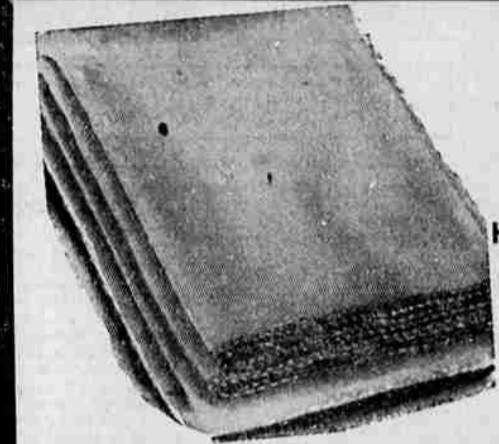

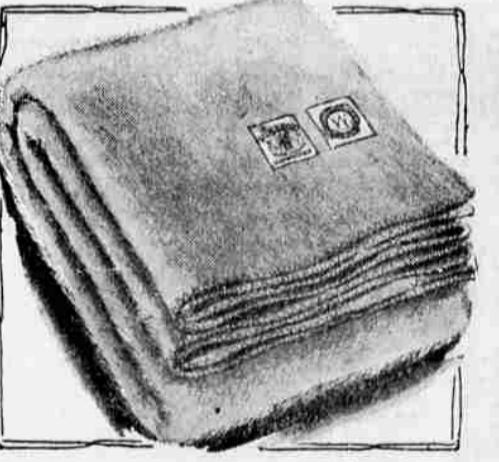
