

### Opinion Polls Favor Cordon

Senator Guy Cordon holds a thin edge over Richard L. Neuberger in his race for reelection as United States senator according to public opinion polls made for his committee by William H. Steiwer, chairman of the Cordon for Senator committee reports.

The same polls show Governor Paul L. Patterson far ahead of Joseph K. Carson Jr. and indicate the election of all four Republican candidates for the House of Representatives.

Since April the polls reveal that Cordon has consistently gained in Multnomah County, says Steiwer. In the same period he has lost some ground outside. Latest Multnomah County compilations give Cordon 36 per cent, Neuberger 41 per cent, undecided 23 per cent. Combined totals in the state outside Multnomah county give Cordon 40 per cent, Neuberger 34 per cent, undecided 26 per cent.

In only two outside counties does the poll show Cordon behind. Clackamas County results give Cordon 36 per cent, Neuberger 50 per cent, undecided 14 per cent. Union county totals give Cordon 34 per cent, Neuberger 50 per cent, undecided 16 per cent.

Trends maintained from early April to the present favor Cordon and if they continue will assure his election, Steiwer said. The totals:

United States Senator: Guy Cordon, 38 per cent; Richard L. Neuberger, 36 per cent; No opinion, 26 per cent.

Governor: Paul L. Patterson, 65 per cent; Joseph K. Carson Jr., 29 per cent; No opinion, 15 per cent.

Congressman 1st District: Walter A. Norblad, 61 per cent; Donald Mitchell, 13 per cent; No opinion, 26 per cent.

Congressman 2nd District: Sam Coon, 46 per cent; Albert Ullman, 27 per cent; No opinion, 27 per cent.

Congressman 3rd District: Tom Lawson McCall, 47 per cent; Edith Green, 25 per cent; No opinion, 28 per cent.

Congressman 4th District: Harris Ellsworth, 51 per cent; Charles O. Porter, 17 per cent; No opinion, 32 per cent.

### Notables Honor Mrs. Roosevelt

NEW YORK (AP)—Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt was showered with greetings and high praise from famous persons throughout the world at a huge 70th birthday party given for her Monday night.

More than 1,000 persons gathered in the grand ballroom of the Hotel Roosevelt to pay tribute to the ever-active widow of President Roosevelt. Guest after guest rose to speak in honor of her. Among them was Dag Hammarskjold, secretary-general of the United Nations.

Birthday messages poured in from such world figures as President Eisenhower, former President Truman, Queen Elizabeth II of England, Indian Prime Minister Nehru and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

When she finally had a chance to speak for herself, Mrs. Roosevelt briefly reviewed the past and then expressed this hope for the United States in the future: "I would like to see us take hold of ourselves, look at ourselves and cease being afraid."

The party was organized by the American Assn. for the United Nations, for which Mrs. Roosevelt is chairman of the board of governors.
