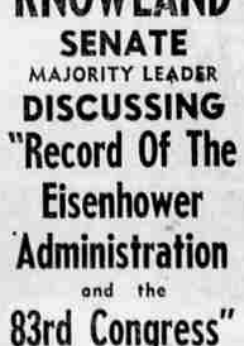

(Continued from page 1) date: Longview chamber of commerce directors joined Monday with the Olympia (Wash.) chamber in opposing construction of a transmission line via Klamath Falls to Shasta dam to send Northwest power into California.

The state of Washington, you see, wanted no truck with a transmission line that would send power from the Columbia river down into Southern Oregon and far Northern California.

At any rate, on April 20, 1951, the appropriations committee of the house of representatives turned thumbs down on the Bonneville-Shasta line and verbally spanked the bureau of reclamation for "doing preliminary work on the line without authorization."

The house appropriations committee was then under a Democratic administration composed of 50 Democrats and only 29 Republicans. The Democratic membership included Representative (now senator) Henry Jackson of the state of Washington.

Who killed Cock Robin? It wasn't Secretary of Interior McKay. He was then governor of Oregon, and happy in his job.

It wasn't Guy Gordon, because he was then as now a senator, and a Republican besides.

And it wasn't Sam Coon, because he hadn't been elected to congress yet.

The announcement of his support of Gordon was made on a radio broadcast in Portland on time paid for by the Democrats for Gordon Committee of which Johnnie Johnson is chairman.
