## Former Polio Victim Aids County GOC

Stricken with polio at the age of eight months, followed by a leg operation, then years in a cast, braces, and finally graduating to a wheelchair that served as motivation for her to get around until she was 14 years old, Leveta Beard, one of GOC's most loyal supporters, now gets around under her own power and climbs the many stairs to the tower at the airport to serve her county in operation "Skywatch."

Leveta is the second child born to Albert Smith and Imo (Young) Smith in Perth, Kansas. There were seven other children.

Not too long after winning the battle with polio, Leveta entered defense work during World War II, helping make B-29 planes for Boeing at Wichita, Kansas. One day at work, she slipped and fell from a huge bomber's wings and broke her back, thus ending two years of war time production work for her.

Following her recovery from a broken back, she came West to Oregon and settled in Klamath Falls in 1946.

She proudly tells of her ancestry, who for generations back, made history in several wars. Isaac Smith, (fourth great grandfather) served in the Boxer Rebellion of 1899, was appointed by President McKinley to West Point for outstanding service, and again decorated for good work, by President "Teddy" Roosevelt.

Leveta's husband, Ira, served in World War II. They live at 4503 Altamont with a foster child, a girl.

In the service of the Ground Observer Corps, Leveta is one of seven GOC team captains whose duty it is to keep the tower at the airport manned the full 24 hours of the day. Besides standing her regular two hour per week watch, Leveta often fills in extra watches herself when some one fails to report for duty on time or doesn't appear at all. Says this ambitious GOC worker: "The schedule must be filled, even though I have to stand the extra watches myself the day I am team captain. There is an urgent need for more Ground Observers in order to relieve this situation." She adds: "Since this is the civilian part of the United States Air Force, any one from 14 years of age and up can serve."
