

Puerto Rican Nationalists To Be Sentenced By Judge

NEW YORK (AP)—Thirteen Puerto Rican members of the Nationalist party involved in two Washington shootings in recent years have been convicted of sedition conspiracy against the United States.

The 13, plus four others who pleaded guilty earlier, now face possible maximum sentences of six years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

Federal Judge Lawrence E. Walsh fined Oct. 26 for sentencing after the jury's verdict last night.

Four of those convicted last night are already under heavy prison sentences for shooting into the House of Representatives from its visitors gallery in Washington last March 1. Five congressmen were wounded.

Another of the convicted Nationalists is Mrs. Rosa Collazo, 43, whose husband Oscar is now serving a life sentence for an attempt to assassinate former President Truman in November 1950.

The Nationalist party seeks total independence for Puerto Rico, now a commonwealth of the United States, even though its people have turned down in referendum voting offers of full independence. Puerto Ricans are citizens of the United States.

The 13 party members were tried on charges of conspiring to bring about Puerto Rico's independence by force and violence and armed revolution.

In his summation, U.S. Atty. J. Edward Lumbard declared, "every one of these defendants has his moral fingerprints on the guns that were used in Washington, and those who participated were praised as martyrs."

Defense attorneys claimed that the Congress shooting and the attempt to assassinate Truman were actions by individual Nationalists and not a conspiracy. They said the prosecution used the congressional shooting to "infect the minds of the jurors."

Several defendants had testified during the trial that they had no idea when they joined the party that it intended violence or gunplay.

In his charge to the jury, Walsh said any defendant must be acquitted if the jury believed he did not know that force and violence were to be used.

The trial started Sept. 8. The four convicted earlier for the Congress shooting were Dolores (Lolita) Lebron, 34; Rafael Cancel Miranda, 23; Irvin Flores Rodriguez, 29; and Andres Figueroa Cordero, 29.

Others convicted were Julio Pinto Gandia, 45, who the government said was the head of the party in the United States; Juan Francisco Orixi Medina, 39; Jose A. Otero, 34; Juan Bernardo Lebron, 31; Carmelo Alvarez Roman, 45; Jorge Luis Jimenez, 34; Armando Diaz Matos, 39; and Manuel Rabaigo Torres.

All are from New York except Jimenez, Matos and Torres, who lived in Chicago.

Brownell Addresses DAs

WASHINGTON (AP)—Atty. Gen. Brownell said Wednesday his justice department staff had carried out a promise made in 1952 "to restore public confidence" in the department.

Brownell addressed the U. S. district attorneys gathered here from all parts of the country, its territories and possessions for a three-day conference at justice headquarters.

He said it was their next task "to retain public confidence" by maintaining a high plane of ethics and professional competence which would demonstrate that the present administration is both "efficient and humane."

Noting that the prosecuting staff in the field represents almost a 100 per cent turnover since the Republicans came in, Brownell said:

"The district attorneys represent the Eisenhower administration in the field. Because your work is dynamic, newsworthy and important, the people look on you as a standard by which to judge how the administration is carrying out its pledges."

Two Hunters' Bodies Found

EUGENE (AP)—The bodies of two deer hunters whose car plunged into the Siuslaw River early Tuesday were recovered Tuesday night.

State Policeman Tom Fithian and a Coast Guard crew dragging the river brought up the bodies of Earl Carpenter, 26, and Donald E. Baldwin, 22, both of Deadwood.

The accident occurred near Mapleton, about 60 miles east of here. It was discovered late Tuesday morning when a passerby noticed the wheels of the car sticking out of the water. The bodies had been thrown out but the men's rifles were inside.

Two persons have died of gunshot wounds and seven others have died of natural causes while hunting.

Air Force Probes Cause Of Washington Jet Crash

WASHINGTON (AP)—An Air Force investigation was under way Wednesday into the crash of a jet plane Tuesday which cost the lives of the pilot, a mother and her two children and seriously burned the children's father.

The plane, an F86d from Andrews Air Force Base, Md., crashed into the backyard of the family's home near Clinton, Md., some 10 miles southeast of Washington. The body of the pilot, 2nd Lt. Robert B. Sandberg of Westchester, Wash., was found two miles away.

There was no apparent explanation for the crash. Gen. Nathan F. Twining, Air Force chief of staff, said the 26-year-old pilot was experienced and that the plane "had been inspected recently and had been flown since inspection."

"The loss of lives in this accident is a matter of grave concern to me and to the Air Force," Twining added. "An investigation is being conducted by a board of qualified Air Force officers."

The plane crashed and burned shortly before noon Tuesday, taking the lives of Mrs. John J. Vaughn Jr., 24, and her two children, John W. Vaughn III, 2, and Rose Ann, 4. Mrs. Vaughn was an expectant mother.

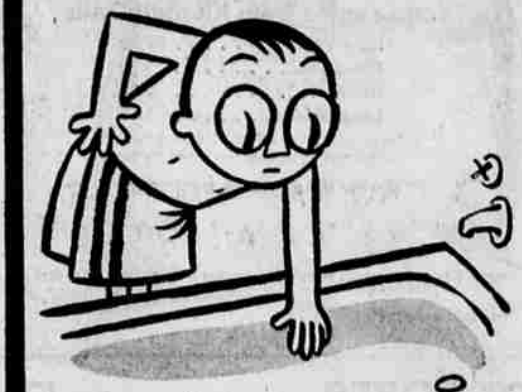
Her husband, John J. Vaughn Jr., 25, a grocery store employee, suffered burns over the upper portions of his body and was described as in serious condition at the District of Columbia General Hospital.

Andrews Air Force Base officials said the pilot was killed in an attempt to abandon his plane shortly after the takeoff from the field on a routine training flight. Base officials said his ejection seat evidently had functioned, but that the plane had not gained sufficient altitude to permit his parachute to open.

They said Sandberg had radioed the base control tower, immediately upon taking off, that a signal on his instrument panel indicated a fire in the rear of the craft and that he planned to swing around and make an emergency landing.

But the plane never made it and crashed in the Vaughn yard, spraying the area with rockets which endangered others in the vicinity. Officials said the plane was carrying rockets because, as part of the 95th Fighter-Interceptor Squadron, it was under orders "to be ready at all times."
