## East-West Disarming Issue Eyed

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—The U.N. disarmament debate neared the decisive stage today as British Delegate Selwyn Lloyd prepared to outline his government's position on the critical East-West issue.

Lloyd, co-author of a British-French proposal used as a basis for the discussions, speaks before the 60-nation Political Committee. He was expected to echo the skeptical tone voiced yesterday by U.S. Delegate James Wadsworth, who said Americans "suspect the Soviet Union of planning world conquest behind their facade of disarmament statements."

Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky has held the recent spotlight in the debate with speeches which the Soviet bloc termed conciliatory. The disarmament debate returned in the wake of a double setback for dogged Russian attempts to air aggression charges against the United States. After haggling for nearly three hours, the U.N. Steering Committee voted 12-2 last night to postpone for two weeks a debate on whether Soviet accusations of U.S. air and sea activity around Formosa and the China Sea should be put on the agenda.
