## Notes Threaten Negro Chemist

CHICAGO (AP)—A noted Negro chemist says he has received a letter threatening the lives of his children unless his family moves from its home in a suburban white neighborhood by Nov. 1.

Dr. Percy L. Julian said yesterday he had turned the letter over to the FBI and added that he had no intention of moving.

Julian, 58-year-old president of a research laboratory and a chemical company, owns a 15-room home in Oak Park. An attempt to burn the home was made in November 1950 before the Julians and their three children moved in and a bomb was thrown at the home in June 1951.

## Tax System To Be Changed

Klamath County Assessor A. R. Dickson and Sheriff J. Murray Britton have just completed a modernization of their tax record system to make the office procedure more efficient and at the same time comply with a state-wide standard tax record system.

In order for taxpayers in Klamath County to benefit by improved and faster service at tax paying time, it is important that the tax statements, covering the property

upon which taxes are to be paid, be brought or mailed to the tax collector.

Code numbers are used to identify the combined levy rate for the various taxing areas of the county.

Account number or tax lot numbers now consists of either a city map number or a township map number to which has been added your tax lot number. This account number should be used in all communications to the sheriff and tax collector or the assessor which

concern your property. Oregon Revised Statute 308-240 provides that lieu of other descriptions. The number refers to a public record kept by the assessor known as the official tax lot record which shows a detailed description of the property as shown on the deed.
