HONOLULU (AP) — An intrepid, 61-year-old raftman, who drifted 6,500 miles from Peru to American Samoa, attributes his survival to "mind over matter."

## Paratrooper Pet Locked Up

CHICAGO, Oct. 22 (AP) — Rocky, the world's youngest lady paratrooper, was locked up today in Lincoln Park Zoo—and there she'll stay.

The 187th Regimental Combat Team decided the zoo was the best place for Rocky, a 16-month-old, 120-pound Hokkaido bear, even though she served with distinction in Korea.

Rocky won fame as the regiment's parachuting mascot. On her first jump, however, three soldiers were bitten before the jumpmaster could get her out of the plane.

Later a mortar shell fragment nicked Rocky's chin and she was awarded the purple heart.

Rocky, who gets her name from Rakkasan, the Japanese word for paratrooper, was accompanied from Oakland, Calif., by 1st Sgt. Gene Castle, 30, of Paintsville, Ky. He raised her from a cub.

Castle said he was donating Rocky to the zoo because most of the men in the 187th are Midwesterners and would be able to drop by the zoo and see her occasionally.

He said the kerosene stove broke down early on the voyage and he threw it overboard. The rest of the way it was raw fish, salt water, and cold instant coffee made with salt water, he added.

"I was never short of food," he declared. "There were plenty of fish in the ocean."

He said his cat, with whom he chatted during periods of loneliness, "enjoyed the trip and was never short of rations either."

When he got home that night Mrs. O'Reilly had gone away with McKay.
