

Vice President Nixon To Campaign For Guy Cordon

Vice President Richard Nixon will be in Oregon Tuesday to campaign for the re-election of Guy Cordon to the U.S. Senate.

The vice president's first talk in the state is scheduled for Tuesday afternoon at the coliseum on the Oregon State College campus at Corvallis. That evening he will speak informally before the Men's Club at the Portland Temple Beth Israel. His major address, to be carried by radio and television, will be at the Portland Masonic Temple, at 8:30 p.m.

Cordon, meanwhile, received the endorsement of seven men, active in public power circles. The seven, who have formed an organization known as the Oregon Public Power Committee, said in a statement that the issue of the campaign between Cordon and his Democratic opponent, Richard L. Neuberger, is "adequate power versus inadequate power. The choice is between full development of our power resources by the federal government, public agencies and private companies—as proposed by Guy Cordon—or limited development of our power plus unlimited control by the federal government, as favored by Neuberger."

The group also said Neuberger "has no conception of the problems which face the state of Oregon, and further, has no understanding of the many-sided question of power development with its allied problems of economy and industrial expansion in the state. He has been guilty of serious errors of fact in his discussions of power development."

The committee is headed by Earl McNutt, a member of the Eugene Water and Electric Board. Its members include Lawrence Hull, a director of Central Lincoln People's Utility District; W. J. Seufert, former president of the Northern Wasco PUD; Louis Courtemanche, a commissioner of the City of McMinnville Water and Light Dept.; J. D. Pusey, a director of the Clatskanie PUD; Charles Belknap, former president of the Oregon Assn. of REA Co-ops; and Ford Northrup, Eugene, a former president of the Northwest Public Power Assn.

Gus Norwood of Vancouver, Wash., executive secretary of the Northwest Public Power Assn., said his organization is non-partisan and "the use of its name for political purposes to endorse Cordon or any other candidate is not authorized."

Neuberger, speaking at Cottage Grove Sunday, said he was an

ardent supporter of the United Nations, and said he disagreed with a statement which he said Cordon made, objecting to the size of U. S. contributions to the world organization.

"Our contributions is just a few pennies, compared with the cost of weapons of death and destruction. I just can't understand Cordon's objections to our contribution to the United Nations," Neuberger said.

Earlier at Oakridge, Neuberger said Cordon had voted against a bill which would have increased personal income tax exemptions and for the Bricker amendment, which would have limited the president's treaty-making powers.

Joseph K. Carson, the Democratic candidate for governor, said in a television broadcast at Portland that his Republican opponent, Gov. Paul Patterson, was playing "footsie" with "utility tycoons."

He said that John C. Higgins, Ralph Calk, former Oregon Republican national committeeman for Oregon; and Gov. Thomas Dewey of New York are members of the Republican "power crowd" who were responsible for Douglas McKay's appointment as secretary of the Interior.
