Army Changes ROTC Policy

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army announced Monday the establishment of a schools division of the Reserve Officers Training Corps with membership limited to 8 junior colleges and 34 military institutes.

The new system will go into effect in the 1955-56 school year. By then, the Army, working with the schools, expects to have a military program specifically designed to fit the needs of military preparatory schools and junior colleges.

Monday's announcement marked a partial reversal of an Army decision last year which would have limited military training leading to a commission to men in four-year, senior colleges. The revised program, inspired in part by strong criticism of that decision from military academies, entitles a man to a reserve commission if he completes six years' train-

ing in preparatory school and junior college, then goes on to get a college degree.

Another requirement for a commission under the new system is that the man attend summer camp between his junior and senior college terms.

In order to retain eligibility for membership in the military schools division, each institution must maintain a minimum enrollment of 100 students.

The 8 junior colleges and 34 preparatory schools included in the program include:

Military junior colleges: Okla-

homa Military Academy, Claremore, Okla.; Allen Military Academy, Bryan, Tex.

Military institutes: New Mexico Military Institute, Roswell, N.M.; Texas Military Institute, San Antonio, Tex.; Brown Military Academy, San Diego, Calif.; Kamehameha School for Boys, Honolulu, T.H.

Missouri Prison Riot Suppressed

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. (AP) — Officials maintained a tight disciplinary clamp over convicts at the Missouri State Penitentiary today after the third mass rebellion in a month.

In the latest outbreak — a food riot Saturday — one prisoner was killed and 37 injured.

Warden Ralph N. Eldson told reporters that "all is calm" now and the men seem relaxed, but he added, "Just one silly kid could set off a new rampage in the dining room."

The riot started in a dining room where 500 to 600 inmates were being fed. A guard reported one convict, apparently objecting to bologna sandwiches, yelled "Flat dog." Others took up the cry and began tossing their plates and food on the floor.

Guards fired on the convicts after they ran out into the prison yard.

All privileges have been taken from the 3,000 inmates. Radios, newspapers and magazines are banned. They also were without yard and recreational freedom yesterday.

Meanwhile, Gov. Phil M. Donnelly and prison officials intensified their study of the state penal system.

The governor is trying to set up a commission to survey the entire Missouri setup.

Work was started on it after the most disastrous riot in the prison's history occurred last Sept. 22. Four prisoners were killed and 30 men injured. Another rebellion Friday was quelled without casualties.

None of the convicts injured Saturday was reported in serious condition.

Nine were wounded by guards. The others, suffering bruises and lacerations, were believed injured in fights between Negro and white prisoners. The Negro prisoners were just being marched into the dining hall when white convicts started their food demonstration.

A guard killed Joseph Coffey, 27,

who was serving a six-year term for burglary and larceny, at the top of a stairs in a cell block. The warden said Coffey was shot after he and other prisoners tossed chairs and furniture down the stairs at the guards. The warden said Coffey refused to heed commands to get back to his cell.

A disturbance also occurred Saturday night in the women's branch of the prison, which is located about a half mile from the men's penitentiary.

Nevada Said Fast Growing

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Census Bureau says Nevada was the nation's fastest-growing state during the last four years while West Virginia showed the greatest population decline.

The bureau's annual estimate of population growth by states showed last night that all but 3 of the 48 states had civilian population gains from April 1, 1950, to July 1, 1954.

West Virginia's population dropped 2.9 per cent during that period while Nevada showed a 33.1 per cent gain. Other states with shrinking populations were Arkansas and New Hampshire. Gains of more than 20 per cent were registered for Arizona and Florida.

The bureau estimated the nation's civilian population — which excludes members of the armed forces — totaled 159,084,000 last July 1. This was an increase of 6.3 per cent from the 149,634,000 counted in the last full census April 1, 1950.

Total population, including the armed forces, was estimated at 162,414,000 as of last July.
