## New SP Lunch Car In Use

Southern Pacific is glorifying the hamburger by dedicating to it the newest cafeteria-style lunch car on any American railroad, president D. J. Russell announces.  
The car, "Hamburger Grill," has just been placed in service on the streamlined San Francisco Overland between San Francisco Bay area cities and Ogden.  
Extra large hamburgers are the feature item and the railroad hopes to make them as famous as its already nationally-known salad bowl and casserole, the rail president said. The car will provide passengers with food items at any time of the day, without need to buy a full meal in the dining car, he explained.  
"The hamburgers contain U.S. Choice beef, one of the finest meat products of Southern Pacific territory," according to J. H. Gridley, manager of the railroad's dining car department. Also featured, he said, will be such items as salad, soup, chili con carne, sandwiches, milk shakes, etc.  
Rebuilt in the railroad's Sacramento shops from a conventional dining car, the new Hamburger Grill includes a combination kitchen-pantry where food items are prepared, a glassed-in display counter where passengers may make their selections and a table area seating 32 persons.

## U. S. Business Mergers Cited

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman Edward F. Howrey of the Federal Trade Commission has ordered a "speedy but thorough" probe of business mergers to determine whether competition is being lessened.  
Citing a nearly fourfold increase in mergers and company sales that took place following the outbreak of war in Korea, Howrey bracketed it with the "trust forming era of 1887-1904" and "a significant merger movement in the 1920s."  
"There is no question that the present merger movement must be carefully assessed," in the light of the antitrust laws, Howrey said late Monday in announcing the new study.  
After two decades when mergers averaged 200 a year, they shot up in 1951 to 730, rose again in 1952 to 822 and fell back a little in 1953 to 793, according to a tabulation accompanying the FTC announcement. Business consolidations in 1951, 1952 and 1953 totaled 2,319, compared with 602 for the previous three years. The all-time high recorded by FTC was 1,216 mergers or business acquisitions in the manufacturing and mining field in 1929.  
The numerical record alone, FTC said, does not tell the story. It said it wants to get at, because it does not differentiate between billion-dollar and small-potatoes combines, and does not throw light on the economic significance of the mergers—the extent to which they may have decreased or deformed competition.  
Howrey said the purpose of the study would be "to provide documented facts on mergers for the information of the commission, the Department of Justice, the Congress and the public."
