

Two Killed In Truck Explosion

FT. CARSON, Colo. (U.P.)—A truckload of phosphorus left after the filming of a war movie exploded and killed two men yesterday. A third was injured critically.

Killed in the violent blast were Louis Sarkas of Encino, Calif., and Royal Lowe of Van Nuys, Calif., both about 45 and employed by Warner Bros. Studio.

Paul Zook, of Colorado Springs, was injured.

The men had driven the phosphorus, used for battle effects in the Korean War picture "Target Zero," away from the main building area to dispose of it. Officials said Sarkas and Lowe were in the truck when it exploded. Zook was about 20 feet away. The cause of the detonation was unknown.

Subway System Holiday Slated

NEW YORK (U.P.)—New York's
"hole in the ground"—the most
famous subway system in the
world—celebrates its 50th birthday
Wednesday.

With the opening of the New
York subways in 1904, a new era
in urban transportation began. The
first subway was opened in Boston
in 1897. But to New York goes
credit for revolutionizing rapid
transit.

The subways have received credit
as an important factor in the
amazing growth of New York.
Now, the huge population of the
world's largest city threatens to
strangle the subway system. The
subways are packed tight with
more than 800,000 passengers twice
a day during the weekday rush
hours. Altogether, an average 4-
200,000 riders use the subways
every day.

The congestion during rush hours

is estimated at three times the
total seating capacity.
The vast transportation network
—now city-owned—carries about
two billion passengers yearly over
a 250-mile web. There are more
than 30,000 employees.
The first line was opened from
City Hall to Broadway and West
145th Street on Oct. 27, 1904.

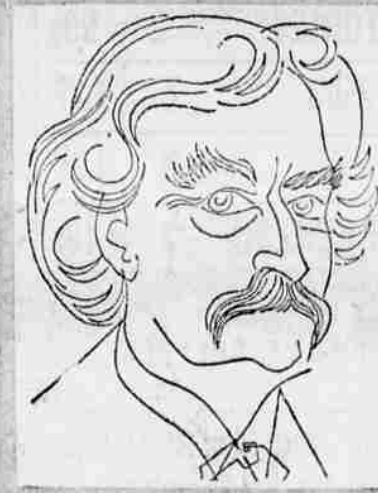
