Vets Attack Cattle Grubs

Veterinary scientists, searching for better ways to control cattle grubs, have come up with another new angle of attack, the American Foundation for Animal Health announced today.

Research veterinarians of the U.S. Department of Agriculture have reported encouraging results with daily intake of phenothiazine during the months when beef flies deposit eggs on the legs of cattle. The drugs are absorbed into the animal's blood stream so they can attack grubs before extensive damage is done.

Treated cattle averaged some 80 per cent fewer grubs than untreated animals, and some were completely free of infestation. Grubs are the larvae of the heel fly. They burrow into the animal from eggs deposited on the hide by the adult fly. After living within cattle several months, they puncture their way out again, usually through the back, and in so doing cost the livestock industry millions of dollars every year in damaged hides and prime meat cuts.

Some success in cattle grub control also has been reported with drug injections which accomplish much the same results as the feeding program, according to the Foundation, but more research is necessary.

The present common method of control by spraying or dusting cattle is considered unsatisfactory. It does not prevent all damage to the hide, inasmuch as treatment cannot be started until the grubs are present under the skin of the back. Better control depends upon the cooperation of all cattle owners in the area.

Hormel To Face Dope Hearing

LOS ANGELES (AP)—George A. Hormel II, midget-packing heir and jazz piano player, has been ordered to plead Nov. 3 to a charge of marijuana possession.

Free on \$1,000 bond, he was arraigned yesterday in Superior Court. Officers said they found marijuana cigarettes in his car when he was arrested Sept. 19.

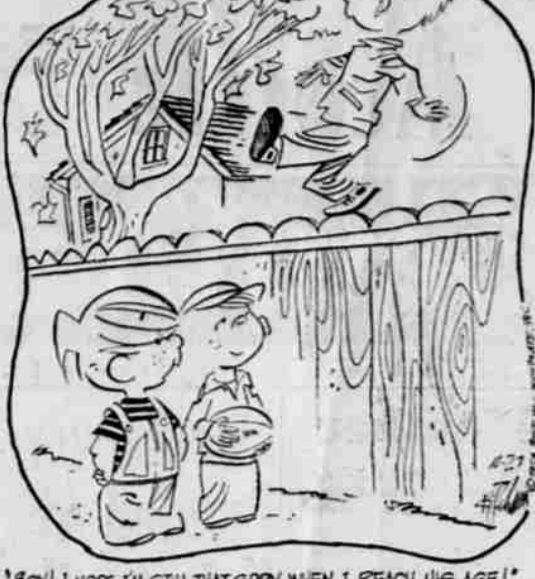

Navy Recruit Regs Changed

Word received from Headquarters, Thirteenth Naval District, Seattle, announces a change in regulations applying to recruit enlistments in the U.S. Naval Reserve.

Non-pay units that provide recruit training are authorized to enlist non-rated personnel in numbers so that the total authorized allowance of the unit will not be exceeded. This regulation applies to enlistment of men between the ages of 17 and 18 and a half, and non-rated women applicants.

Since May, 1953, recruit enlistments in the Naval Reserve have been limited to pay units only, in such numbers whereby non-rated personnel attached and associated with a pay unit did not exceed 65 per cent of the total authorized allowance.

Pay units are now authorized to enlist non-rated personnel and cancel instruction 1139.6B of March 22, 1954.

Consent declaration of parent or legal guardian is required for 17-year-old men, and women under 21.

Announcement was made by H. H. Randecker, assistant to the reserve coordinator.

UN Discusses World Health

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—The president of the United Nations Security Council said last night that the emotional and physical health of a few individuals can determine the survival or extinction of today's civilization.

Ambassador William Borberg of Denmark, serving as council president this month, told the first foundation dinner of the Valley Forge Heart Research Institute that the world needs "more science in statecraft and more statesmanship in science if we are to pay effectively for a productive world at peace."

He said, "We must recognize, to begin with, that the only true realities in the world are individual human beings." Governments, nations and powers, he said, "are images, not realities."

"Consider the question: Do the individual members of any 'nation' want war?" Borberg continued. "The answer surely is no."
