

# Republicans Believed Sure To Retain Control Of Both Oregon Legislative Bodies

(This is the last of six stories on the candidates and issues in Oregon's general election. This one deals with the Legislature.)

By PAUL W. HARVEY JR. SALEM (U) — Republicans, who have controlled Oregon's Senate since some time in the 1870's and

who have held a lead in the House since 1937, are almost a certainty to repeat again. In the 30-member Senate, the Republicans have 11 holdover members and the Democrats 2. Three Republican candidates are unopposed. So, even before the election, the GOP has 14 members. And several of the other Republican candidates

are from districts that haven't voted Democratic since the post-Civil War days. In the House, where all 60 seats are at stake in every general election, the Republicans find things almost as rosy. Twenty-nine Republicans and nine Democrats are running for reelection to the House. Since House members generally are re-elected, and since nobody seems very mad at what the Legislature did two years ago, the Republicans seem sure to win the House, too. In 1953, the Republicans had a 26-4 margin in the Senate, and 40-11 in the House. It looks as though the 1955 Legislature will be split in about the same proportion.

With the next Legislature facing tough financial, highway and unemployment problems, it appears Oregon will have experienced men to handle the job.

In the Senate, it is possible that 27 of the 30 members will have had previous legislative service. In the House, two-thirds of the members might have had prior service. This fact is important, because the sooner the lawmakers know the ropes, the sooner the Legislature can start making laws.

There are some interesting legislative contests, heightened by the fact that nine members of the 1953 House are seeking elevation to the Senate.

They are Monroe Sweetland, Milwaukie, Democratic national committeeman; and these Republicans—Speaker Rudie Wilhelm Jr., Portland; Mark O. Hatfield and Lee V. Ohmart, both of Salem; Donald R. Husband, Eugene; Carl H. Francis, Dayton; John Misko, Oregon City; Francis W. Ziegler, Corvallis; and Joseph M. Dyer, Astoria.

Speaker Wilhelm and Sen. Dean Bryson are the Republican candidates for Multnomah County's two Senate seats. They are engaged in a real struggle against Sen. Phil Brady, labor leader, and Lew Wallace, a former senator who has run for governor.

Another tough battle is Dyer's contest against Sen. Robert D. Holmes, Gearhart, who manages

an Astoria radio station. Both men are highly popular in their home district, which includes Clatsop and Columbia counties.

In the House contests, the Democrats did much better in filling their places on the tickets. Only five Republicans are unopposed, a far smaller number than usual.

As to other contests on the ballot, two unopposed Supreme Court jus-

ices will be re-elected. They are Justices James T. Brand and William C. Perry.

Fifteen circuit judges also will be elected and 14 have no opposition. The contested race is for probate judge in Multnomah County.

between William L. Dickson, Oswego, former state legislator, and Thomas R. Mahoney, former state senator.

Fourteen counties will choose district attorneys, with contests only in Lane and Multnomah counties.

Entries may be made either as individuals, groups or classes. Prizes will be awarded to each division — elementary, junior high or senior high, consisting of first through sixth, seventh through ninth, and 10th through 12th grades respectively.

Each division will share 30 prizes of \$3.175 will be awarded the grand prize being \$250 intended as a one-year scholarship to an art school of the contestant's choice.

The national contest is approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals and the National Education Association.
