### Field Said Recuperating

LONDON (AP) — A U. S. Embassy spokesman in Warsaw said Wednesday Hermann Field is "entirely free to come and go as he pleases" in the nursing home outside the Polish capital where he is resting.

Field, a Cleveland, Ohio, Architect, was released recently after five years in a Polish jail. An embassy spokesman, in a telephone interview Wednesday, said Field "is regaining weight and strength but wants to continue his convalescence."

"He is entirely free to come and go as he pleases, but is not in the physical condition to do so. I don't mean that he is ill, just that he is tired and a bit worn out."

The spokesman said Joseph Flack, the U. S. ambassador to Poland, has seen Field twice.

Tuesday night Hermann Field's British wife, Mrs. Kate Margaret Field, said she had received a telegram from her husband "saying he is longing to come home to me and the boys but that he needs to recuperate for a short while before traveling." The Fields have two boys, Hugh, 11, and Alan, 9.

### Demos Given TV, Radio Time

NEW YORK (AP) — Democratic leaders have a promise of free radio and television time from one network but their demands for time to balance recent speeches by President Eisenhower were rejected by two other networks.

The National Broadcasting Co. announced Tuesday it had offered Democratic National Chairman Stephen Mitchell a half hour of radio and television time this Saturday evening. The TV broadcast would be at 8:30 and the radio time at 10:30, it said.

NBC's announcement came in response to a request from Mitchell for free time to make up for recent speeches by the President. Mitchell said these speeches had "an unusual amount of partisan political content."

Mitchell suggested that the networks cover a speech by Adlai Stevenson, titular leader of the Democratic Party and its last nominee for the presidency, Thursday or Saturday night.

Mitchell's request was turned down by the Columbia Broadcasting System and the American Broadcasting Co.

### Tub Sailor Changes Mind

WHIDBEY ISLAND, Wash. (AP) — The man who said he was going to put-put to Alaska in his pontoon-equipped floating bathtub threw in the towel Wednesday morning.

Roy Bergo, who reversed the usual situation by putting his bathtub in the water, reported he had sprung a propeller shaft and was giving up within half an hour after setting out at 7:05 a.m. for the second day of his odyssey.

A Coast Guard patrol boat messaged to its shore base that the 50-year-old mariner had come alongside and pronounced: "Giving up; going ashore at Double Bluff to obtain transportation home."

Double Bluff was where he had spent the night after a 12-mile first leg of his cruise. He had set out Tuesday from Edmonds, north of Seattle, in his weirdly contrived craft and a two-horsepower outboard motor.

The Coast Guard, which sent an escort with him, had warned him of a probable "reckless operation" charge if he met with a mishap.

Undaunted, the former state reformatory guard set out in his 36-inch long tub without charts, navigation instruments or experience. He had left behind a wife, a 9-year-old daughter and a crowd of skeptics.

The latter weren't surprised when Bergo advised the Coast Guard escort, "No soap."
