UN Political Committee Adjourns After Approving Five Power Arms Meeting

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—The U.N. Political Committee took a day off today after unanimously approving a call for five-power talks on disarmament. The resolution was supported by both Russia and the West but veteran diplomats warned any real arms agreement was a long way off.

The vote, taken after two weeks of debate on the arms issue, came last night. It brought expressions of hope that the rare Soviet decision to join with the West in backing a common proposal might indicate a new era of cooperation.

The general air of satisfaction was marred somewhat by Soviet Delegate Andrei Vishinsky's statement that the disarmament talks might be doomed if the West insisted on using American proposals as a basis for discussion by the five powers.

Vishinsky wants the British-French proposal on which his own disarmament plan is based to serve as the foundation for negotiations.

The Soviet warning served as a reminder that East and West are still sharply split on fundamental points of disarmament. There is no indication the Soviets intend to relax their position despite recent gestures of cooperation.

The committee-approved resolution, which is certain to receive an okay from the General Assembly, has three main points:

1. It authorizes the U.N. Disarmament Commission to place the whole arms problem before a subcommittee consisting of Russia, Britain, France, the United States and Canada—the five sponsors of the resolution.
2. It calls on the subcommittee—which failed to reach any agreement in a series of meetings in London last spring—to make new efforts to agree on regulation, limitation and major reduction of armed forces and conventional armaments.
3. It calls on the committee to consider all arms proposals within its terms of reference.

The Russians refused to cosponsor the resolution until the other powers agreed to delete any reference to the American plan, which provides for strict international supervision of disarmament. The resolution as approved makes a general reference to "all proposals."

English Dock Meeting Held

LONDON (AP)—The government called waterfront employees and dock union leaders together today in a fresh attempt to end the stubborn dock strike which has paralyzed England's major seaports.

As the walkout, now involving 43,000 stevedores, went into its 25th day there were warnings that its effect on Britain's export trade is becoming calamitous.

"Goods for the Christmas trade overseas have been held up so long that major export sales are being lost," declared John Burchart, an official of the National Union of Manufacturers.

Elkan Simons, president of the British Jewelers Assn., said the stoppage is causing irreparable harm to Britain's export trade in jewelry, gift wares and fancy goods.

The British post office said many Christmas packages for distant points now cannot be delivered until after the holiday.

Pin-Ball Craze Hits Japan Courts

TOKYO (AP)—Japan's pin-ball craze—it's called "pachinko" here—has hit the divorce courts.

The game has been named "correspondent" in eight divorce cases this year by Japanese husbands and wives who complained their mates spent too much time—and money—at it.

Actress Faces Felony Hearing

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Actress Lynne Baggett faces a probation hearing and sentence Nov. 17 on a felony charge of hit-run driving in the death of a 9-year-old boy.

A jury convicted her yesterday of that charge but acquitted her of a second felony count of manslaughter. The hit-run charge carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

The 27-year-old blonde testified she "blacked out" and fled after a collision in which Joel Watnick died last July 6.

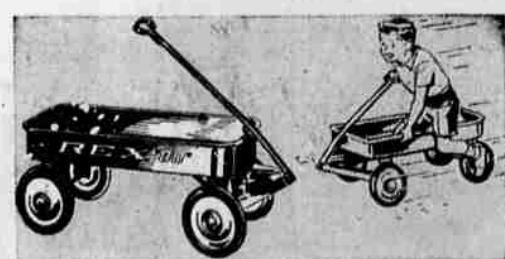

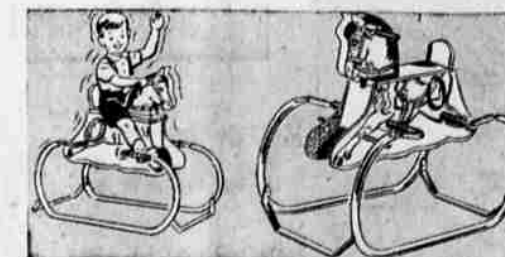

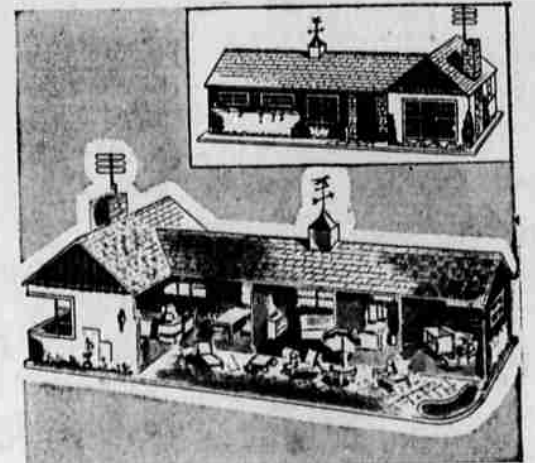
