

Chilly Canada Air Hits East

Gusty northerly winds blew chilly Canadian air over wide areas in the eastern half of the nation Friday. It also was in the cool side in most of the Northwestern states.

The cold air streaming southward from Canada indicated only moderate rises in temperature. Mild weather, however, appeared in prospect again for Florida, parts of Georgia and in the far Southwest.

Light rain fell during the night in a belt from the Great Lakes southward to the Eastern Gulf of Mexico and over the southeastern states. The showers changed to snow flurries in Minnesota. Showers and snow flurries also fell along the eastern slopes of the Central Rockies.

Partly cloudy or clear skies were reported in other sections of the country.

Heaviest rainfall was reported in the southeast, with nearly an inch in Macon, Ga., and Pennsylvania, Pa.

Readings ranged in the 30s and low 40s, in the Northern states from the Rockies to the Pacific Coast. Below freezing temperatures and strong northerly winds were reported in the Northern Plains.

Man, Wife Team Film Wild Life Feature For Disney

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The lion is not the king of the jungle.

The vulture is not such a bad creature after all.

There is no such thing as the lust to kill in wild animals. These are some of the things I learned from a fascinating couple named Al and Elma Milott. They have just returned from two years and eight months in Africa, where they filmed another of Walt Disney's nature studies, "The Lion and His Domain."

Can you imagine being alone with your wife or husband 24 hours a day for most of two years and eight months? That's the way it was with the Milotts during their African stay. It might prove wearing to most couples, but the Milotts are a remarkable pair.

Mrs. Milott, a plump, happy woman, began her love of nature early. Her father was a Seattle newspaperman who loved the outdoors, and Elma took to the camp fire girl routine. She helped convert Al, a University of Washington graduate, after they married and set up a photography studio in Ketchikan, Alaska.

"Whenever he got nervous, he'd take a walk," Elma said. "He could walk five minutes from the studio and be in the wilds."

"I used to hunt in Alaska," soft-spoken Al added. "But I gave that up when we started photographing the animals. You can't do both; you get to be too sympathetic."

The Milotts took only a pistol when they invaded the wilds of Africa, and then only because it was required by law. They shot 100,000 feet of film, of which about 3,000 will be used in the finished product. Much of it is fabulous material, and they learned some interesting facts about the animals. For instance:

"The lion is not the king of the jungle. The elephant is; he can go anywhere he wants. The lion will give way to an elephant or a rhino. But the lion will attack a baby elephant."
