UF Official Warns Workers

"The price of freedom is eternal vigilance," quoted Rex Dye, chairman of last year's United Fund-Red Cross drive, in a talk Thursday which followed his presentation of seven UF-BO Oscars and certificates.

Dye compared the community's acceptance last year of the one unified drive to freedom following a revolution, since the community had been "freed" from "revolutions" — i.e., campaigns every few months.

"But we have to be vigilant," he warned. "The community response has been wonderful, but have we overestimated the ease with which this campaign could be successful?"

He complimented groups which were awarded certificates and Oscars.

"These certificates are set aside for firms whose employees feel close enough to the community to sign up near 100 per cent in support of the in-plant committee's payroll deduction plan; Oscars are awarded for outstanding participation of firms and employees," he explained.

Scheduled to receive both Oscars and certificates at Friday's noon report meeting were Great Northern, East Side Electric, Montgomery Ward's, Emil's, Klamath Falls Creamery, Smith-Bates Printing.

Peace Through Strength Seen

WASHINGTON (AP) — West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer said Friday the Western world should seek peace through strength.

Adenauer, now seeking approval by his own and the other Western parliaments of agreements to make Germany a sovereign, armed partner, solemnly warned: "Let us beware of illusions. We in Germany are particularly well informed about the difficulties which must be surmounted on the way to an easing of tension with the Communist-dominated world."

We also know that extreme caution and vigilance are called for."

He also repeated, in a speech prepared for a National Press Club luncheon, the judgment in which President Eisenhower joined him Thursday—that Russia's proposal of last week for four-power talks on German reunification, European security and an Austrian peace treaty offer nothing new.

The Soviet aim continues to be to disinterest the United States in European questions and to eliminate Atlantic influence from European affairs," he said.

The Chancellor's speech was in German. His country's diplomatic mission supplied an official English translation.

Fireman Dies From Injuries

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A sixth fireman died Friday from injuries suffered in the blast in the rear of a chemical plant Thursday which killed three fire officials and two other firemen.

The latest victim was James Boyle, 32. He had suffered second and third degree burns of 40 per cent of his body.

The freak explosion—there was to fire—did not damage the inside of the two-story Charles W. Berg Laboratories plant. It shattered a tank minutes after the arrival of firemen summoned by a telephone report of seeping ammonia fumes in the area.

The plant, which manufactures chemical and oil derivatives, was empty in the early morning hours when the blast occurred.
