Mine Claim Hearings To Be Held

MEDFORD — Protest hearings on 88 unpatented mining claims, covering 14,000 acres in the Union Creek area of the Rogue River National Forest, are scheduled to be held November 3-6, at the Jackson County Courthouse at Medford. Announcement was made by Forest Supervisor J. H. Wood.

Claimants requesting the hearing and scheduled to appear include U. S. Mining Exploration Company, known as Kover and Young group, and J. M. Vassinder. Bureau of Land Management representatives will conduct the hearing.

Under existing mining laws, unpatented mining claims on national forest land may be contested for cause by the federal government. Claimants are notified officially of contest and allowed 30 days to request a protest hearing. The hearing provides opportunities for claimants to disprove contest charges. Failure to request hearings or failure to appear at hearings constitutes admission of contest charges and claims become subject to invalidation.

In addition to claims to be heard next week, 247 other claims, involving 39,520 acres near Union Creek also have been contested. Claimants P. L. Farborough and J. F. McKee failed to request hearings on claims covering 34,770 acres of that group. The remaining acreage will be scheduled for future hearings.

The claims included in the November 3-6 hearings, together with those previously invalidated, constitute the majority of the claims at Union Creek. More than 86,000 acres were covered by claims in that area.
