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A major resolution called for payment of state unemployment compensation to striking workers who have made a formal offer to arbitrate a labor dispute.

The convention also urged amendment of the present regulations to permit payment of compensation to strikers who have found, but later lost, jobs with other employers.

The present law deprives strikers of unemployment benefits and does not permit a striker to receive compensation if he refuses to return to his original job.

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U. S. Airmen Held In Turkey

IZMIR, Turkey (AP)—Four American Air Force men were held in a Turkish prison Monday-charged with insulting the Turkish flag in an after-midnight escapade.

The servicemen, attached to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's Southeast Europe headquarters here are to be tried Nov. 8.

Under Turkish law they can be jailed one to three years if found guilty.

Witnesses testified at a preliminary hearing they saw the men pull down a Turkish flag from a downtown building and step on it at about 1 a.m. Oct. 30. The flags were flying in celebration of the 31st anniversary of the Turkish Republic the day before.

The airmen denied any intent to insult the flag and testified it was pulled down accidentally in a friendly scuffle between them.

A NATO spokesman identified the four. They included Airman 2C Henry R. Dunn, 1615 Ocean Beach, Longview, Wash.

Ponderosa Pine Planting Made
