Garry Lee Wilson and Ricky Stuart were inducted and received their bobcat pins.

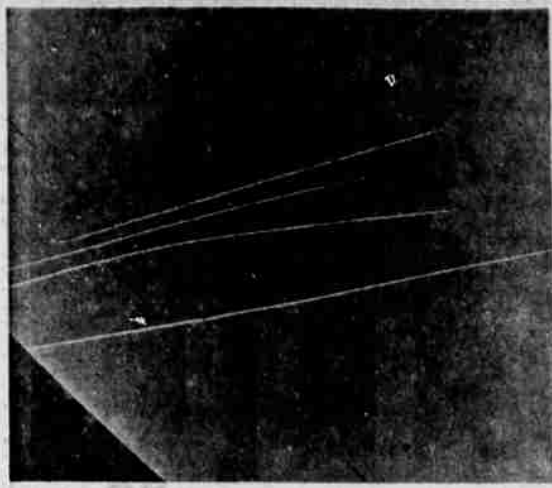

L-B Officials Promoted

WEED — Henry G. Reents, 40, has been appointed as assistant superintendent of the Long Bell Lumber Co. here it was announced by the management this month.

Reents, whose previous position was superintendent of the company's plywood plant here, started with Long Bell in the lumber department November 1, 1939. He served continuously with the company except for two years when he was in the Navy during World War II. He saw duty in the South Pacific as a lieutenant, and for one year had command of a Navy submarine chaser.

Reents resumed work at Long Bell after he was discharged from the Navy as assistant plywood superintendent. He advanced to superintendent in June, 1951.

He holds a B.S. degree in forestry from the University of California, and before coming to Long Bell was employed by the U.S. Forest service for two years. He is married and has two sons.

John H. Dohrn has been appointed to succeed Reents as superintendent of the plywood plant. Dohrn's former position was assistant superintendent of the plywood plant in Weed. John McKown has been appointed to assistant superintendent of the plywood plant.

Political Party Funds Revealed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Official reports on campaign finances show that the Republican National Committee went into the final lap of the congressional campaign with a surplus of funds while its Democratic counterpart operated in the red.

In a report to the House, the GOP organization said Saturday that up to Oct. 15 it had collected \$1,356,215 and spent \$1,214,783.

A separate report from the Democratic committee showed collections of \$960,134 and spending of \$1,031,669.

The reports are required by the corrupt practices law of 1925.
