

Red China Population Announced

TOKYO, Nov. 1 (AP) — Red China today claimed the staggering population of 601,930,000 people.

The Peiping radio broadcast the new figure, saying it was based on a direct census taken in June 1953. It gave no explanation as to why the figure only now is being released.

The new figure is 100 million more than the most recent estimates used by the Reds themselves, and from 125 to 150 million more than most non-Communist estimates.

In terms of population, the new figure makes the newest member of the Communist group of nations lower nearly twice as large as her nearest competitor, India, where the 1951 census reported 358,829,185 people.

Compared with China, Soviet Russia's population numbered 193 million according to a 1947 figure released by the Kremlin. Recent Soviet estimates have used the

round figure of 200 million. Even so, Red China now boasts more than three times as many people as her "big" Communist brother, to whom she has been exporting much-needed food in return for military and industrial aid.

The 1950 census in the United States showed 150,697,361 people,

but recent estimates have pushed this above the 160 million mark.

The Peiping radio said the 1953 census was taken by the State Bureau of Statistics. It said the census did not reach Formosa, where the Chinese Nationalist govern-

ment of Chiang Kai-shek holds sway, nor "a few border areas and in regions where local elections had not yet taken place."

Nevertheless, Peiping apparently included not only the estimated 9,000,000 Chinese now on Formosa,

but also the estimated 12 million overseas Chinese who live outside China. Many of these hold dual citizenship under Chinese law — that of the country in which they live and Chinese citizenship too.

The Chinese population now makes up almost one fourth of the human race.

The Chinese Nationalists, using estimates not unlike those of 150 years ago, arrived at the figure used for many years of 450 million people. After World War II this

figure was increased by some sources to 475 million.

When the Communists took over in 1949 they adopted this estimate. Only recently have they begun speaking of a larger number in their broadcasts.

Richard Neuberger Claims

— He Supported the Semon-Geary Bill To Protect Klamath Water But — this Associated Press Dispatch of April 19, 1951 Reprinted Below Proves

His Claim Is False!

Senate Endorses Water Diversion Stop Bill

Exactly on party lines, the Oregon Senate yesterday endorsed a measure to require legislative consent to any diversion of water to any other state.

The vote was 20 to 8. Republicans voting for the measure, Democrats against.

It has already passed the House of Representatives by 46 to 3 vote but goes into the Senate Law committee, for a little retiring, the Associated Press reported from Salem.

The bill is aimed at preventing the federal government from diverting Oregon water into California. The U. S. Interior Dept. is known to have designs on waters of the Klamath, Rogue and Umpqua rivers. The bill also includes rivers forming the state boundaries, the Columbia and Snake.

Democrats arguing against the measure called it illegal and unconstitutional. They declared the federal government has jurisdiction over all navigable streams, and that any stream is considered navigable as long as it can float a log.

GOP CLAIM
The Republicans, admitting the bill might be unconstitutional, regards to the boundary streams, say the rest of it is all right. They claim a river isn't navigable unless boats use it.

A clause providing that if any part of the measure is declared unconstitutional the remainder will be permitted to stand probably will be written in by the Senate Law committee. Such a device is known as a savings clause.

Sen. Richard Neuberger, Portland Democrat, led the assault on the bill.

He declared Oregon water should be sent to California to increase the state's population and thus create a bigger market for Oregon products.

Sen. Ben Day of Medford, defended the bill, saying "Oregon is attempting to have a voice in the use of its own water. California wants water from the Klamath, Rogue and Umpqua rivers, and there isn't enough water now for Oregon's needs."

HITCHCOCK
Sen. Phil Hitchcock of Klamath Falls said "the people of Oregon should determine what waters are surplus, rather than Congress or the California Legislature. The federal government might arbitrarily take Oregon water and give it to California just because there are more people there. He defended the constitutionality of the bill, saying Montana has a similar law."
