Spud Testing Service Told

Potato growers are reminded that greenhouse testing service is available for uncertified potatoes. The county agents office reports that eight commercial samples have already been submitted by Klamath County growers.

Greenhouse facilities are used to test plant commercial samples. Space is available after certified seed samples have been planted. Space occupied by certified seed samples becomes available for commercial samples in early January.

The fee for test planting a 400 tuber sample of uncertified potatoes is \$15. Desirable tuber size for test planting is three ounces.

Information on percentages of disease present in a commercial lot of potatoes is as reliable as the sample is representative. Samples taken in cellars should be gathered from all parts of the cellar.

Varying percentages of leaf roll infection in fields this summer combined with high aphid populations suggest the probability of many

instances of severe virus spread. It is likely that many commercial lots are not of sufficiently high quality to be safely replanted.

Probability of trouble from net necrosis caused by current season leaf roll infection increases rapidly as percentage of tuber perpetuated leaf roll in seed increases above one per cent.

Test planting of a truly representative sample is the only reliable method of measuring percentage of virus infection. Examination of tubers for presence of net necrosis is not a reliable method of determining percentage of infection.

Ben Jefferson Johnson of Tulelake, taking migratory waterfowl after hours; fined \$25.

Robert Lee Shaw of Big Bend California, killing protected non-game birds; fined \$10.

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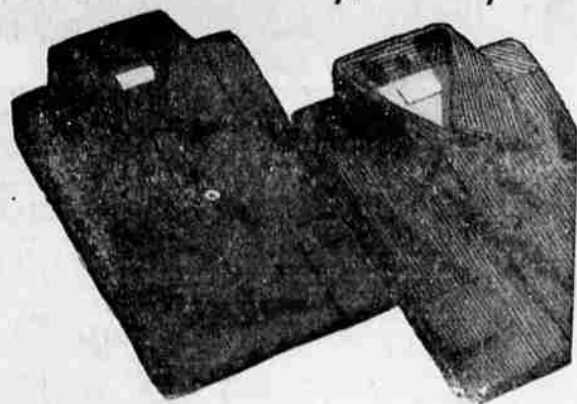
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
