**McKeldin Wins Despite Trend**  
 BALTIMORE (AP)—Gov. Theodore Roosevelt McKeldin smashed a precedent and survived a Democratic trend last night by becoming the first Republican governor ever reelected in Maryland.  
 The 53-year-old Baltimorean defeated Democrat H. C. Byrd, former University of Maryland president, in an election which saw the Democrats:  
 1. Regain a 4-3 majority of the seven-man House of Representatives delegation, where the Republicans had won the same edge in the 1952 Eisenhower landslide.  
 2. Elect Democrat C. Ferdinand Sybert, former speaker of the House of Delegates, attorney general over the Republican incumbent, Edward D. E. Rollins.  
 3. Strengthen their control of the State Legislature.  
 With 1,095 of the state's 1,345 polling places reporting, McKeldin had 331,724 votes to 275,739 for Byrd.

**Voters Back Light System**  
 PORTLAND (AP)—Portland voters Tuesday approved a million-dollar-a-year tax for 10 years to get better street lighting. They rejected, though, a measure to raise double that amount for a new city hall and other improvements.  
 The city has been spending about a third of a million annually for maintained the system without improvement. The new plan is to put a modern system on 324 miles of arterial streets and add 4,000 intersection lights.  
 A measure to increase the city's tax base, and to remove the present license on businesses and professions, was defeated. So was a proposal to set up a special group to deal with the city's mass transportation problem. The defeat of the latter kept the problem in the hands of the city council, which was trying to get rid of it.  
 There were seven annexation proposals. The city approved all of them, but two—Ardenwald and Collins View—appeared to have rejected the idea of joining the city.

**Republican Wins In Texas**  
 DALLAS (AP)—A handsome newcomer to politics whipped the confident Democrats of the Dallas congressional district, giving the Republicans their only Texas victory in the general election.  
 Bruce Alger's victory over Democrat Wallace Savage of Dallas was an upset—and even Alger admitted he was surprised he had saved the Republicans from a shutout.  
 Alger had a margin of 3,111 votes over Savage, with a total of 27,683 votes in the final count of the night.  
 Gov. Allan Shivers walloped his Republican opponent, Ted Adams of Crockett, with a total of 286,811 votes to 32,597.  
 U. S. Sen. Lyndon Johnson won just as easily, with 266,360 votes to 47,064 for the Republicans' Carlos Watson of Brownsville and 1-772 for Fred Spangler of the Constitutional party.  
 Congressman at large Martin Dies of Lufkin rolled up such a big lead over Republican Tom Nolan that the Election Bureau, an agency sponsored by Texas newspapers and radio stations, didn't bother to count the votes.
