## USAF Recruits To Get Leaves

T-Sgt. Donald Adams, in charge of local Air Force recruiting with offices at the post office building, Klamath Falls, announced today that young men of this area who enlist in the Air Force will now be given a 10 day "vacation" at the end of their basic training.

This delay in route, as it is known in military terms, not to exceed 10 days plus travel time, will be granted to all Air Force basic military training graduates, prior service airmen, and Air Force ROTC enlistees, upon completion of basic training at Parks Air Force Base, California.

The 10-day leave policy will become effective with classes graduating in December 1954. Those airmen graduating in classes prior to the effective date of this new policy will be granted ordinary leave at the end of their training.

Travel by private automobile will be authorized for airmen having automobiles in their possession at the time of departure from the basic training center, and also for those who can show evidence that such travel should be authorized in accordance with travel policies.

All other graduates will be required to purchase tickets to their point of leave, and from there to their new duty assignment. They will be allowed to select their mode of travel.

Accrued pay and advance travel pay will be paid prior to departure from the basic training base.

## Forecast On Cattle Told

Specialists of the U.S. Department of Agriculture say that cattle numbers will be down on January 1 from the 95 million head reached last January. They point out that over the years, cattle on farms and ranches usually go up slowly and then down at a more rapid rate. They expect the same course may be followed again. They point out that when numbers decline slaughters increase by the sale of cows and other cattle. If it happens fast it may greatly increase slaughter

and decrease prices. If liquidation is gradual prices will be about the same as the last two years. They expect next year's calf crop to be a little smaller than this year. Farmers will probably sell more cattle for slaughter and the output of beef will still be high. The specialists figure that American

people will eat more than 70 pounds of beef per person, annually, for the next few years. As the population increases, demand for

beef will be strong and after some to new heights in the early '60's.
