 TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)—A crippled Air Force plane crashed while trying to make an emergency landing at Tucson Municipal Airport last night, killing four airmen and injuring 11 others.
 The plane, based at Ellington Air Force Base, Houston Tex., had just taken off when it developed engine trouble. While trying to return, it struck power lines, smashed into the ground short of the runway and broke into flames.
 Three of the injured were in serious but not critical condition in Pima County Hospital.
