## Veteran's Day Plans Made

Since the U.S. Congress has changed November 11 from Armistice Day to Veterans Day, it is now a day for veterans of all American wars and citizens alike, to celebrate the ending of those wars.

In accordance with this plan, the local Allied Veterans Council, which represents all the veteran organizations here, has gone on record to adjust plans for November 11.

It is planned that the hour of 11 a.m. will not be observed since it has only the significance attached to World War I. There will be no requests for the closing of business for ceremonial purposes during the day. Everyone is urged to carry on their normal routine during the day and starting at 6 p.m., all interested organizations and the public are invited to meet at the county courthouse where a rally will start to celebrate Veterans Day. Appropriate music and fun making will prevail. Veteran clubs will hold open house for their members and guests and the spirit of celebrating will carry on for the evening.

No parade is scheduled for marching units, however, all groups and individuals will be asked to participate in this rally which will be held after business and working hours.

This will be the first year of forming plans for an All Veterans Day, which replaces Armistice Day on November 11.

## Peruvian Singer In Tax Trouble

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Yma Sumac, Peruvian songstress whose concert here 10 months ago drew unkind words from San Francisco music critics, is now in trouble with local federal tax men.

The U.S. Internal Revenue service filed a \$2,177 tax lien Friday against Miss Sumac and her local representative, Wilfred L. Davis. The government contends they failed to pay federal amusement taxes on her concerts here and in nearby Berkeley.

After Miss Sumac's local concert, Chronicle music critic R.H. Hagan wrote that her rendition of "Claire de Lune" sounded "a little like DeBussy played on a musical saw."
