Sheppard Jury Sees Death Shots

CLEVELAND (AP)—The Sheppard murder jury took a Veterans Day holiday today after getting its first look at grisly pictures of the victim's bloody corpse.

The black and white photographs showing the once-attractive Marilyn Sheppard lying in a circle of blood on her bed, brought no visible emotions from the jurors when they were passed around yesterday.

Most of the jurors took a cursory look and passed the pictures on. Last week they had looked at seven colored slides of the dead woman's head, smashed by the state describes as 27 or more savage blows.

Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard, 31-year-old osteopath, is charged with first degree murder in the July 4 slaying. He claims a bushy-haired intruder killed his wife.

Mrs. Esther Houk, wife of Mayor J. Spencer Houk of suburban Bay Village, where the slaying occurred, testified yesterday that Dr. Sheppard knew a head injury "was the hardest to evaluate."

Dr. Sheppard claims he suffered neck and head injuries while struggling with his wife's mysterious killer. The state, however, says whatever injuries he received that night were trivial.

The witness, appearing for the state, said her sister was in an automobile accident last spring and her insurance did not completely cover the car's damage. The sister was not hurt.

Mrs. Houk said she discussed the situation with Dr. Sheppard, a family friend.

"Did he participate in a conversation about the subject of which was how to pretend a head injury?" assistant county prosecutor Saul Danaceau inquired.

"He said that, as a doctor, he knew a head injury was the hardest to evaluate," Mrs. Houk said. "It pertained to the insurance in the case of an accident, and where there was no obvious injury, a head injury could be easily claimed as far as the insurance was concerned."
