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Bus Service For Riverside School Discussed By Board

Feasibility of bus service to Riverside School was discussed, reports from the budget committee and from board members attending the Oregon State Board members annual meeting at Salem were heard and other business was taken up Monday night at a meeting of the boards of school districts No. 1 and No. 2 held in the high school.

Action of the Klamath Union High School Board members resulted in the naming of Thursa Savage as attendance clerk at KUHS. A report was given by Andrew Loney, director of music education Klamath Falls school, on band uniforms which have been ordered. The 100 new uniforms for boy and girl members of the band will

be red and black, red coats, black pants and skirts with red stripes. West Point Type hats with black and red trim and red plume.

The suits ordered from the Oswald Uniform Co., through the J. C. Penney Co., Klamath Falls, are expected in the next six or seven weeks.
