### November Spud Estimate Told

Up in the East and down in the West is the November potato crop estimate story. Production of 346,943,000 bushels for the nation is one million bushels higher than estimated last month. The 280,149,000 bushels estimated for the 29 late states is up about one million bushels from October's estimate, but is 10 million bushels under 1953 production and two and one-half million bushels less than the 1952 crop. The nine Eastern late states are estimated to have 104,444,000 bushels; the nine Central late states 65,200,000 bushels. Combined these states are 2,200,000 bushels higher

than a month ago. The 11 Western states are estimated at 110,505,000 bushels, down 1,100,000 from a month ago. The 11 Western states produced 115,700,000 bushels last year and 115,300,000 bushels in 1952. The estimate for Idaho now is 42,075,000 bushels. Down three million bushels from last month and 3,800,000 bushels less than last year. Idaho's production in 1952 was 42,800,000 bushels. There is no change from last month for Washington or California late, but the estimate for Oregon was raised 400 thousand bushels.

### Film Producers Flee L. A. Smog

RENO (AP) — Two independent film producers are negotiating to set up a year-round movie studio in Western Nevada because it is free of "smog psychosis." Producers Sterling Silliphant and John Barrowell said Wednesday their plans call for constructing a studio in Carson City, 30 miles south of Reno. "We hope to attract the best young minds in the industry—actors, producers, writers and directors—into this fresh, creative climate free of smog psychosis," they said in a statement. They are here to shoot a film.

### Army Units To Change Posts

ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — Gen. Charles L. Bolte said Thursday the Army's new unit rotation plan will require that at least as many of its proposed 24 combat divisions be kept home as are sent overseas. Bolte, Army vice chief of staff, said the plan will get under way next July when the 1st Infantry Division, now in Germany, will change places with the 10th Infantry Division at Ft. Riley, Kan. At the same time the 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team in Japan will trade posts with the 508th Airborne Team at Ft. Campbell, Ky., he said, and a similar exchange will be made by the 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment at Ft. Meade, Md., and the 2nd Armored Cavalry Regiment in Germany.

### Denver Area Dam Completed

DENVER (AP) — The last bucketful of concrete was poured late Wednesday on Denver's 12 million-dollar dam in South Boulder Creek Canyon. Officials figure that by next spring the dam could pile up an additional 20,000 or 30,000 acre-feet of water for the drought-stricken Denver metropolitan area.

### Air Academy Program Told

DENVER (AP) — The Air Force Academy will be neither a trade school nor a "football factory," Lt. Gen. Hubert R. Harmon, superintendent, said Wednesday. Primary emphasis, Harmon said in an interview, will be on the humanities, the social and the physical sciences. Three years of English and three years of history will be required for each cadet, these courses interrelated so he will be reading the literature of a particular period at the same time he studies its history. Flying will be a secondary, though essential, part of the four-year curriculum, he said. As for football and other spectator sports, Harmon said he wants no athletes in the Air Academy who lack the intellectual capacity to stay the course.

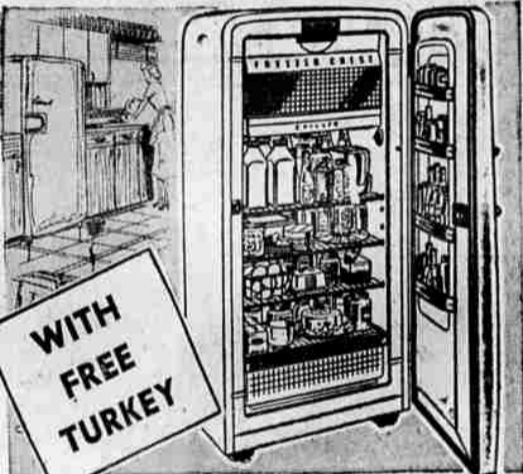

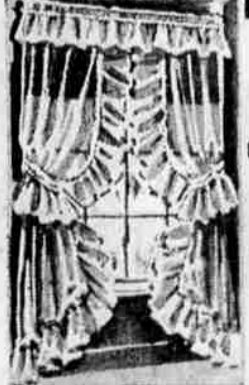

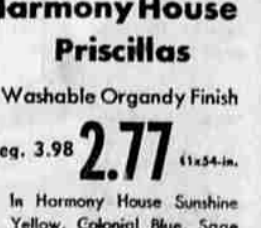
