

KF To Hear Lecturer At Armory

A prophetic lecture series will open at the armory Saturday night, November 13, featuring as speaker the nationally known Bible lecturer, Alden O. Sage, Los Angeles, California.

Adding to the interest of the meetings will be technical films relevant to the subject, which will be shown before each lecture.

Speaking before large crowds in many of the principal cities of the country, Sage has been acclaimed a great Bible scholar for his concise and forthright presentation of Bible prophecies and their relationship to the present age.

The opening night's topic, "Survival and the Hell Bomb — Will Man Destroy Himself with Hydrogen Explosives?" is being presented by special request in the Klamath Falls area. Before the illustrated lecture at 8 p.m. the technical film, "God of the Atom," will be shown. This film has been called one of the greatest productions dealing with the recent atomic tests at Bikini.

In addition to colored slides, Sage will introduce to Klamath Falls the new black light illustrative device, Duorama.

In charge of the special music for the series will be Hartwick Hansen, Lincoln, Nebraska, noted evangelistic singer.
