Egypt Junta Puts Naguib Under Arrest

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Maj. Gen. Mohamed Naguib was in the political ashcan Monday following his ouster as Egypt's president by the ruling military junta.

Two civilians were killed and two policemen seriously wounded in a clash early Sunday, before Naguib's ouster, in suburban Helopolis. A government spokesman said the fighting occurred when police closed in on Youssef Talaa, fugitive leader of the Muslim Brotherhood's secret order, and his guards tried to clear the way for his escape, using machine guns and hand grenades.

Oregon U.N. Leader Talks In K. Falls

Dr. Karlin M. Capper-Johnson, head of the Oregon Association of United Nations, explained the purpose and organization of the U.N. and the specific purposes of the OAU to interested persons at a luncheon Saturday in the Winema Hotel.

Dr. Capper-Johnson, who is professor of history and international relations at Lewis and Clark College, emphasized that the U.N. is a democratic association dedicated to the tireless task of building a warless world. It is not a world government; nor is it attempting such; rather it is a piece of machinery to be used by peoples and nations of the world to promote and maintain international peace and security through democratic means.
