"Make it a Family Affair" was the theme of the day with handcraft displays around the room relating to the 1954 birthday project, "Let's be Different Together."

Education Week Commemorated

CHLOQUIN — Grades from one to six commemorated National Education Week with a window exhibit at Gienger's Store. The fifth grade, taught by Ross McIntyre, has been studying petroleum products and they arranged a poster display of the petroleum industry and petroleum products. An interesting variety of material, writing and art work, including clay sculpture by the primary grades and embossing of foils by the fourth grade was prominently displayed. The sixth grade prepared a display of rocks and household items made from rock in connection with a recent study of minerals and a collection of art work entitled, "Fun with Seeds."
