### Irrigation Leader Named

Fred Rueck, incumbent, will hold the office of director of Horsetly Irrigation District, at least until the second Tuesday of next November, according to a decision by Attorney William Ganong.

There was question whether Rueck or his opponent, H. E. Oberbeide, would be named director when voting November 9 ended

in a tie. A legal statement from Ganong, released by John Hayden, HID secretary, discussed the matter.

Ganong's conclusion based on Oregon Revised Statutes 545.014, sub-section 2, is that Rueck is en-

titled to hold office until his successor is elected and qualified. Since nothing in the law authorizes holding an election other than on the second Tuesday in November of each year, the incumbent will hold office until that time. Whether a

director will be elected then for a two or a three-year term will be decided later.

The post of director of the district was the only issue on HID's ballot.

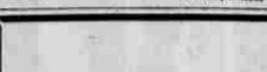
