**US To Aid Viet Nam Training**

SAIGON, Viet Nam (AP) — Gen. J. Lawton Collins announced Wednesday that he is negotiating with the French and Vietnamese for the United States to take over "basic responsibility" for the training of troubled, Communist-threatened South Viet Nam's national army.

Collins, President Eisenhower's special ambassador to Viet Nam, quickly added that there were no plans for immediately replacing the French military officers and men now training the 250,000-man native army which has been equipped largely by the United States.

Instead, he explained to his first news conference since arriving in Saigon 10 days ago, an American-advised training program similar to that used in South Korea, Greece and Turkey is anticipated.

## Barrymore's Hard Exterior Covered Gentle Character

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The death of rough old Lionel Barrymore has robbed Hollywood of one of its most colorful and sentimental characters.

How he would have snorted if he had been called sentimental in his lifetime! He likes to growl and grumble like the world's greatest grinch. It became an act with him and he was easily imitated by night club mimics.

But that exterior toughness was only to hide a softhearted gentleman who was sincerely interested in people. He would appear to be

unconcerned with others, but occasionally he would expose his sympathetic nature. When a prominent Los Angeles boxer got in trouble on a dope rap, Lionel arranged to have a heart-to-heart talk with the lad in an attempt to straighten him out.

During his 23 years at MGM Barrymore was greatly interested in the younger talent on the lot and tried to help newcomers along with gruff words of advice.

He always led off interviewers who questioned him about his own feelings. He tried to picture himself as a doddering relic. But he was sharp as a tack. The last time I saw him was when he was waiting for Joe DiMaggio to appear for a guest spot on his radio show. I mentioned that the ballplayer's then wife Marilyn Monroe was also there.

"Well, she can arrive late with me any time she wants," he replied.

Lionel carried the secret of his real self to his grave. But a member of the family once told me of the tragedy of his life.

"Few people remember it, but Lionel had two daughters," the person said. "Both died when they were three."

The family member recalled

Lionel's weeping one time as he recalled what might have happened if his daughters had lived. Such a loss would be hard for any parent. And no one ever filled the void in his life left when his second wife, Irene Fenwick, died 18 years ago.

And so Lionel adopted an outwardly bitter attitude toward life. But perhaps his real feeling was

expressed in the final words of his autobiography, "We Barrymores": "These are the important things: youth, and health, and someone to love you."

He closed the book with words from Macbeth starting "Tomorrow, and tomorrow, and tomorrow." Sentimentally enough, these were the words he was reciting when stricken.
