Double Amputee Serves As Ground Observer Official

Although Lada Wirth is a native of Bohemia, he is proud to call himself an American. He holds the title of supervisor for the Ground Observer Corps, covering Weyerhaeuser timber camps 8, 6 and 4. In spite of his physical handicap of being a double amputee, he holds down a steady job with Weyerhaeuser as a guard at Camp 4, and serves the Ground Observer

Corps at the same time. Using their own radio network system, each of the other two camps are supplied with code numbers that identify themselves to Wirth when they spot planes in the air, and he in turn reports their observations to the filter center at Portland, using his own code number to let the center know the location of the planes or the sight of some "unusual" object in the air. The U.S. Air Force is taking every precaution to see that the skies are being watched from every remote section of the Western Pacific states, and all danger areas throughout the United States.

Lada Wirth is one of thousands of volunteers who give of their "time to help safeguard this nation's peace. He says: "I enjoy being a member of the GOC and I think the work of the ground observer is vitally necessary for the defense of our country. I think more people should be interested enough to participate, and join up with the Ground Observer Corps of America to do their part to safeguard this "land of the free" from attack by dictatorial nations."

Wirth was born June 19, 1901, and is the second of seven children born to Anna and John Wirth of Dux, Bohemia. Two brothers, Vernon and Henry were also born at Dux. In 1905, the Wirths came to America with their three boys and settled at Trinidad, Colorado. The last four children of the Wirths were American born.

When Wirth was 41-years of age, he came to Modoc Point to work in the mill there. He moved to Klamath Falls in 1945. He is a veteran of World War I, serving in the Naval Air Force with the rating of 2C-CM.

Wirth wears artificial limbs as the result of a railroad accident that severed his left leg just below the knee and the right one just above. With the aid of a cane he climbs stairs and gets around wherever he chooses.

FBI Arrests Eastern Red

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Junior Irving Scales, whom the FBI said has been running the Communist party's activities in Tennessee and the Carolinas for more than three years, was arrested here last night. Federal agents arrested the 34-year-old Scales on a warrant sworn out at Wilkesboro, N.C., under the Smith Act. This act outlaws any conspiracy to teach and advocate the violent overthrow of the U.S. government.

J. Edgar Hoover, FBI director, said Scales, also known as Joe Shields, has been active in the party in North and South Carolina since 1946.

Scales did not resist when he was arrested on a residential street corner. The FBI here declined further comment.

Hoover said the long hunt for Scales began when he disappeared from his home at Carrboro, N.C., Oct. 6, 1951. If convicted, Scales could be jailed for 10 years, fined \$10,000 or both.

At a hearing before a U.S. commissioner, bond was set at \$100,000 over Scales' protest.

Scales is a grandson of a former North Carolina governor, A. M. Scales.

Dancer Plans To Marry Oilman

SANTA MONICA, Calif. (AP) — Dancer Vera-Ellen and oilman Victor Rothschild plan to be married tonight at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in the San Fernando Valley.

They obtained a marriage license here yesterday. Both gave their ages as 31. Rothschild said this will be his first marriage. Vera-Ellen, who used her legal name Vera Ellen Robe, on the license application, was divorced from dancer Robert C. Hightower in 1946.
