



LOWER LAKE REFUGE units, with the exception of units two and three, will be open for pheasant hunters November 20 and 21, according to word received today from the US Fish and Wildlife Service. Hunters must be in possession of a California hunting license, are not allowed over two dogs per hunter and must abide by all hunting laws. Hours will be from 8 a.m. until 4:30 on the two days, with hunters being checked upon leaving the hunting area. No part of the Tulelake Refuge will be open to hunting. Pheasant tags are required and birds must be tagged immediately after taking.
