UAL Passenger Record Told

Air transportation's phenomenal growth was highlighted this week when United Air Lines passed a major milestone by carrying its 30 millionth passenger. She was Mrs. Marie Crawford, 37-year-old secretary of Springfield, New Jersey, who boarded the company's noon flight, DC-7 Mainliner "The Continental" at New York for a seven-hour 55-minute non-stop flight to Los Angeles. United, which was conceived

April 6, 1926, took 21 years to carry its first 10 million passengers (1947); four more years to reach the 20 million mark (1951) and only the last two years to attain its present record. Currently, the company's fleet of 181 planes is flying nearly 300,000 miles daily, the equivalent of 12 times around the globe at the equator.
