

Annual Essay Contest Held

The seventh annual National Essay Contest on employment of the physically handicapped, open to all high school juniors and seniors is now under way. This contest is sponsored each year by The President's Committee on Employment of the Physically Handicapped and cooperating Governor's Committees.

"A Decade of Progress in Employing the Handicapped" is the title of this year's essay. National prizes are \$1,000 for first; \$400, second; \$200, third; \$100, fourth, and \$100 for fifth. State prizes will be given to winners in bonds with \$100 to first, \$50 to second, \$25 each to third, fourth and fifth.

The essay winning first place in Oregon will be entered in the national contest. Five winners in the national contest will receive a trip to Washington, D.C., with expenses paid in addition to prize money. The Disabled American Veterans contribute the prizes on the national level. The Oregon Machinists Council and Portland Aerie No. 4, Fraternal Order of Eagles contribute the state prizes. Last year's Oregon prize winner was a senior in Echo High School and she won third place in the national contest.

This is the only contest sponsored by the federal government and is approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals. Superintendents, high school principals, and teachers have given enthusiastic endorsement to this contest. Full particulars will be mailed to all high school principals in Oregon.

TUNIS, Tunisia (AP)—French sources Monday reported 21 persons killed in a new clash between Tunisian nationalist rebels and French soldiers. The latest violence came on the eve of the anticipated announcement of a 10-day period of grace in which the rebels would be asked to lay down their arms.

Church Seeks Rules Change

LONDON (AP)—The Assembly of the Church of England has called for a change in the method of appointing its bishops and deans—a function in which Britain's Prime Minister has an important role.

A resolution approved by the Assembly recently said the present system "is open to objection and should be modified." It did not indicate what changes should be made.

A church spokesman said the

resolution was considered at present only an expression of opinion and would not be pushed at this stage.

The Church of England is Britain's state church. The sovereign now makes the appointments on the "advice" of the Prime Minister. By custom, the Prime Minister first confers with the Archbishop of Canterbury, spiritual head of the church.

Like all prime ministers in the past 20 years except Neville Cham-

berlain, Prime Minister Churchill is a member of the church. Chamberlain was a Presbyterian.

The resolution objecting to the established appointment method was approved by the Assembly after Dr. Cyril Garbett, archbishop of York, told members it was wrong for spiritual society to have its chief officers appointed by one who need not be either a churchman or a Christian.

He was joined by Lord Selborne, a prominent lay leader, who said there were fears that some future prime minister might not care about church appointments and might be open to bad advice.
