Music Gifts Suggested For Child

One of the most charming, warm, beautiful and challenging gifts you can choose for someone in the family is a musical instrument.

The variety of instruments matches any gift budget and can suit any degree of musical interest and skill and age group.

Of course, you've got to know who is going to get the gift. If it's going to be for the whole family, then it will be something like a piano or organ. Many families have pooled their in-the-family gift funds for one major gift like this.

But while it's going to provide a center of fun for the kids and a relaxing hobby for the adults, it takes expert advice by a reputable dealer to buy the gift.

You'll want to listen to the tone and resonance of such an instrument. And you'll want to plan on your floor space and room arrangement in buying it.

If the gift is going to be for the children, your selection can cover all of the simple rhythm and melody instruments. The tiny toys will like drums and rhythm sticks. But the four and five-year-olds will go for ukeleles and flutes or tubas and cornets—now available in plastic.

If the musical instrument is for the teen-agers, look at the guitars available at your local music store. This instrument is a good accompaniment to singing. But make sure it has been constructed well, because it is sure to be passed around the party soon.

Accordions are popular among the teen-agers. There are semi-accordions, 12-bass and 120-bass jobs, each with an increased playing range and increased price.

For the kids who go for South American rhythms, there is the Bongo—a small pair of drums with a high beat; and the Congo—a tall, tapered drum with a deep tone.

If the instrument is to be for school, that will require your talking with the head of the music department. The selection is very wide: woodwinds, brasses, percussion instruments or strings.

If the instrument is for hobby, don't overlook the old recorder—a flute-like woodwind with a haunting tone.

Ingenious New Hobby Kits Make Fine Children's Gift

An exciting new line of hobby kits, which translate "science" into "fun," will offer a rich opportunity to shoppers for children's Christmas presents.

In addition to buying a Yuletide gift which gives the child hours of pleasure, they may find they've opened the door to a valuable future career.

The kits were announced last fall as part of a national program by Industrial America, Inc. Taking part in production were top names

in U. S. industry and outstanding educational sources. Included among the latter were Encyclopedia Britannica and Chicago's Museum of Science and Industry.

All are hailed by industrial leaders as "new and effective tools in the field of public education." U.S. Department of Commerce officials predict they'll give "genuine stimulus" to improving the nation's technology.

But enough for the testimonials—what are the kits all about?

Eventually, say the sponsors, they will cover all branches of science. At present they cover five: optics and light rays, observing and forecasting weather, electronics and radio, the mysteries of rocks and minerals, and functioning of human bodies.

The weather kit, for example, produced by Taylor Instrument Companies, comes with a handsome map and accurate forecasting instruments. It also includes a book, explaining in simple words how and why the equipment works.

Electronics Kit No. 1, manufactured by RCA, has material for building a radio receiver and small, one-tube transmitters. There is other equipment for building and testing electro-magnets, and for working with flowing electrons.

The medical kit for future doctors is made by Bauer and Black. It features "X-ray Eddie," a plastic inflatable model which shows in three dimensions the respiratory, circulatory, skeletal and digestive systems. Eddie serves, too, as a patient, for working with first aid equipment.
