Judges Fine Five Hunters

Five hunters arrested by federal game officers and Oregon and California police pleaded guilty and were fined in Klamath Falls and Tulelake courts.

Daniel Lee Wait, 21, Riddle, Oregon, was fined \$35 by District Judge D. E. Van Vactor of Klamath Falls for hunting migratory game birds with a shotgun not properly plugged.

Blair Freel of Klamath Falls appeared in the same court and paid a \$25 fine for hunting pheasants after sunset.

John Evan Asteline, 34, Yreka, who was arrested near Tulelake, was charged with hunting pheasants with an improperly plugged shotgun. He was fined \$25 by Judge Victoria Thaler of Tulelake.

Ernest Clifford Conard, 41, Medford, appeared before Judge Thaler and paid a \$50 fine for possession of untagged pheasants, and for possession of game birds in transit. Five pheasants in his possession were confiscated and turned over to the Red Cross.

Joseph Richard Southwick, 51, Willis, California, charged with hunting migratory waterfowl after hours, was fined \$25 by Judge Thaler.
