Churchill's Distrust Of Reds Told

WOODFORD, England (AP) — Prime Minister Churchill says that even as the Germans were surrendering in World War II, he made plans to rearm them if the Russians advanced further into Western Europe.

The veteran Prime Minister, 80 on Nov. 30, spoke anew of his long-time distrust of the Soviets at a birthday rally last night. He told the crowd: "Even before the war ended, and while Germans were surrendering by hundreds of thousands, I telegraphed Lord Montgomery directing him to be careful in collecting German arms and to stack them so that they could easily be issued again to the German soldiers with whom we should have to work if the Soviet advance into Western Europe continued."

Stalin, he declared, was "carried away by the triumphs of victory and acting as if he thought he could secure for Russia and communism the domination of the world."

Churchill said he believes he was "the first well-known person publicly to state the fact that we have to have Germany on our side against Russian Communist aggression."

The London-Paris agreements to rearm West Germany, he continued, resulted from a "vast reversal of British, American and of European opinion... brought about only by the policy of Soviet Russia itself and above all by Stalin, the dictator."

The world front that has been established and is being strengthened against Russian Communist aggression will, I believe, preserve mankind from another disaster infinitely more fearful than any we have ever known or even dreamed of in our wildest nightmares," he declared.

Once German rearmament is ratified, he said, "the path will be clear for those contacts with Soviet Russia from which I still hope a peaceful and easier and ever more prosperous future for the whole world may spring and grow."

Vishinsky Flown Home

MOSCOW (AP) — The body of Andrei Vishinsky was flown home today as the Soviet government announced it would give a state funeral in Red Square to the late deputy foreign minister and chief Soviet delegate to the United Nations.

Informed sources said the announcement of the state funeral meant Vishinsky, who died in New York Monday after a heart attack, would be buried alongside other Communist notables in the Kremlin wall, behind the Lenin-Stalin Tomb in Red Square.

A chartered four-engine Stratocruiser left New York for Paris last night with the massive copper casket.

Accompanying the body home were Vishinsky's widow Kapitolina; the couple's daughter Zinaida; Georgi Zarubin, Soviet ambassador to the United States; and six other members of the Soviet representation in the United States.

Meanwhile, Jacob Malik, Soviet ambassador to Britain, left London by plane last night for New York to replace Vishinsky temporarily as head of the Soviet U.N. delegation. There has been no announcement of Vishinsky's permanent successor.
