

US Business Leaders Urge Extension Of Trade Plan

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Committee for Economic Development, a private research organization of business leaders, today urged a five-year extension of the reciprocal trade program and "gradual and selective tariff reduction."

The CED policy statement, although in the main supporting President Eisenhower's tariff program, went farther than the President in some respects.

Cattle Feed Methods Told

D. E. Alexander, former Klamath County cattleman and onetime owner of the Rock Creek Ranch on Upper Klamath Lake, is recognized in the December issue of the Country Gentleman for his successful feeding operations.

Alexander, who at one time ranged hundreds of head of cattle on the upper lake ranch and had extensive mill and feeding operations at a ranch at Merrill, moved his residence to Napa, California several years ago.

He is credited with cutting disease losses in cattle sharply by feeding 10 milligrams of antibiotic per 100 pounds, live weight. Most noticeable results were in less shipping fever in young calves, near-elimination of liver flukes and curbing of death loss to just two head out of 3000.

Children Hurt In Bus Crash

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Thirty-one school children were injured, at least five seriously, when a school bus crashed into a tree here yesterday. The driver said the accident happened when he tried to prevent three musical instruments from sliding against the steering wheel. He was treated for shock.

Driver Harold C. Fetter, 33, was quoted by police as saying the bus went out of control when he reached for the instruments and swerved off the road. The bus was filled, carrying an estimated 60 youngsters.

The bus was returning students from Marion-Franklin High School, south of here, to their homes.

Idaho Man Wins Northwest 'Grassman of Year' Title

PORTLAND — November 22 — Milt Branch, a grass and cattle man from Midvale, Idaho, is the Pacific Northwest "Grassman of the Year" title was revealed here today by the Portland Chamber of Commerce, sponsors of the regional contest. The winner received a \$1000 Wade-Rain irrigation system at a Chamber luncheon held at the Multnomah Hotel.

Branch, the regional winner, is known as "Johnny-Come-Lately" in this business of grassland farming for grass has meant the difference to him between success and failure. The Idaho rancher started on a sub-marginal 320 acre dry land farm in the early thirties and has built his operation until he now owns 8000 acres of land where "Grass is Gold." Each year since he began, Branch has seeded about 100 acres to improved varieties of grass. He has established large plantings of dryland alfalfa which have helped provide a good supply of hay and pasture. He has 260 acres of irrigated hay and pasture land in addition to some grain raised for feed. "It was grass that took the patches out of the seat of my pants and gave us what we have today," the Idaho man said in expressing his strong belief in grassland farming.

The dissenters were John D. Biggers, board chairman of the Libbey-Owens-Ford Glass Co., Toledo, and Ernest Kanzler, board vice chairman of the Universal C.I.T. Credit Corp., Detroit.
