Endowment Given Medical School, CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—A New York investment banker has endowed a professorship of medicine at Harvard Medical School in honor of Dr. Samuel E. Levine, longtime Boston newswoman, now regarded as one of the world's authorities in heart diseases. Charles E. Merrill, in making an initial gift of \$400,000 to the university to provide the major part of the endowment, said Dr. Levine, "He has helped me to a great degree from time to time - indeed, I believe he has saved my life." Dr. Levine is clinical professor of medicine at Harvard. A native of Lomza, Poland, he once sold papers on the street of Boston and his education at Harvard College and Harvard Medical School was made possible by the Old Boston Newsboys Union.

Churchill Answers Press, LONDON (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill emphasized Thursday his wartime readiness to act to stop the Soviet advance into Western Europe. A storm of press criticism followed the aging conservative leader's disclosure Tuesday that he once thought of throwing Hitler's beaten troops against the Russian steamroller. Newspapers of all political views called the disclosure ill-timed and said it might wreck chances of agreement with the Russians. Replying Thursday to a parliamentary question by a Laborite leftwinger, Sydney Silverman, Churchill recalled a message he sent in May 1945 to Gen. Eisenhower, then supreme Allied commander. It said: "I have heard with some concern that the Germans are to destroy all their aircraft. I hope that this policy will not be adopted in regard to weapons and other forms of equipment. We may have great need of these some day, and even now they might be of use, both in France and especially Italy."
