Riot Staged By Insane Criminals

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — Insane criminals staged a two-hour riot at the New Jersey State Hospital yesterday, wrecking their dining hall and causing injuries to several attendants.

Twenty-three of the 371 inmates were involved, actively or passively. Hospital officials said that among passive participants was Howard Unruh, 33-year-old ex-GI who in 1949 shot and killed 13 persons at Camden in the bloodiest street slaughter in the nation's history. Unruh, who is suffering from deterioration of the brain cells, an incurable disease, surrendered meekly with the others when they could not resist for long.

Dr. F. Lovell Bixby, acting commissioner of institutions, asked if any action would be taken against the 23, said, "The law specifies you cannot punish an insane man; the courts can't punish them, so how can we?"

Dr. Howard S. Magee, hospital director, said a "hard core" of five inmates led the frenzied crowd in the dining hall.

Forty inmates leaped with 10 attendants through broken windows, dropping 12 feet to the courtyard. Another attendant, Earl Hubbard, was seized by two of the rioters and beaten about the head. Many inmates squeezed out through the door.

Those who went through the windows suffered cuts. One attendant suffered a possible broken ankle. Some of the 23 rioters still in the dining hall went on a vandal spree—smashing windows, tables, benches, lights and dishes and starting a fire, which was put out quickly.

Bixby began to talk to the rioter, and the five ringleaders told him they wanted to arbitrate. They said a fellow inmate had been unjustly convicted and committed to the state hospital. When assured that the inmate's case would be investigated, the ringleaders agreed to surrender.

Whaling Magnate Faces Huge Fine

LIMA, Peru, (AP)—Five whaling vessels of shipping magnate Aristotle Onassis' fleet must pay a three-million-dollar fine within five days, a Peruvian Navy court ruled yesterday.

Peru charged the ships, herded into the port of Paita Nov. 15 by Peruvian warships and planes, were operating within the 20-mile belt of the Pacific sea claims as territorial waters. Lawyers for Onassis have contended three of the ships were outside the 200-mile limit and that Peru's claim to waters that far out violates international law.

Measures if the fine is not paid in five days were not announced.

ANKARA, Turkey (AP)—Turkey has turned down Russia's invitation to the Red-sponsored European security conference, saying the parity is aimed at preventing ratification of the Paris accords on rearmament of West Germany.

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Woman Scientist Testifies For State In Murder Case

CLEVELAND (AP) — A dainty woman scientist began unfolding the newest chapter today in the state's case against osteopath Samuel Sheppard, on trial in a charge of murdering his wife.

The story is still being written in blood.

Miss Mary Cowan, a medical technologist, went back on the witness stand this morning to describe the tests she made on stains found in the Sheppard home—particularly on the basement steps.

Her evidence may indicate that whoever killed 31-year-old Marilyn Sheppard did not immediately leave the house after the crime. On the basis of this and connecting testimony, prosecution lawyers said, the state may ask:

Did the killer go from the second-floor bedroom, scene of the crime, to the basement? Why?

Did he go there to wash? To hide something?

Why did he not flee the house as rapidly as possible, especially since Sheppard claims there was a struggle in which he, the doctor, was twice slugged into unconsciousness by the marauder?

The state says there was no "hushy-haired" assailant, that Sheppard himself battered his wife to death with a instrument that has never been found, and that his motive arose from his relations with other women.

Hence the importance of the stain on the basement steps.

For days, prosecution and defense have been locked in desperate struggle over this point.

Miss Cowan followed detectives who gave similar testimony.

She is tiny, sweet-faced, bespectacled. She said she has been a medical technologist for nearly 16 years. She now is employed in the coroner's office.

Miss Cowan said she found human blood on steps leading to the second floor, and on the third and sixth steps, from the top, in the basement.

In the house, she said, she conducted two kinds of chemical test — "leuco-malachite green, and phenolphthalein." In the laboratory,

she ran four other analyses. She cut two pieces of wood from the basement steps, she said.

The defense has suggested that the blood specks in the house might have been left by a dog, Koko, that formerly belonged to the Sheppards.

In later testimony, Miss Cowan may identify, as to type, the blood that stained the steps.

A prosecution attorney said Marilyn Sheppard's blood was typed "RH-negative with an M-factor." Sheppard has yet to be confronted by Susan Hayes, the 24-

year-old hospital worker who formerly was his assistant. The state contends he was "infatuated" with her.

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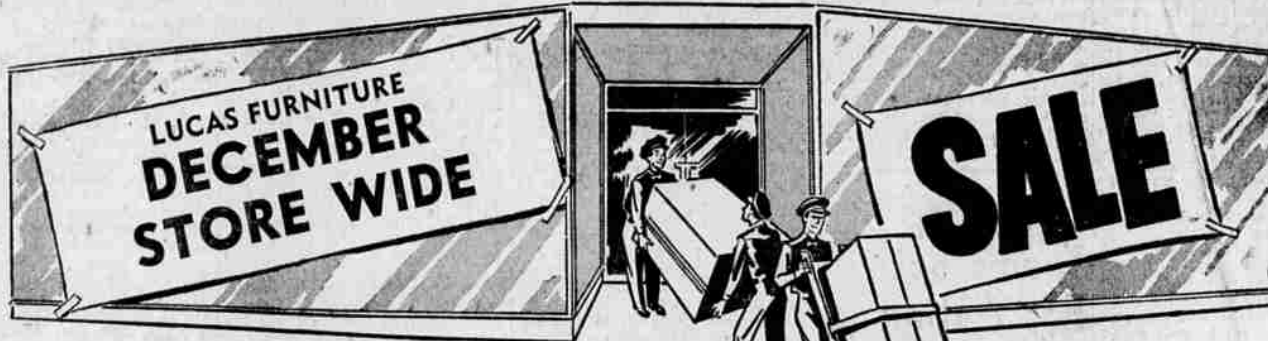
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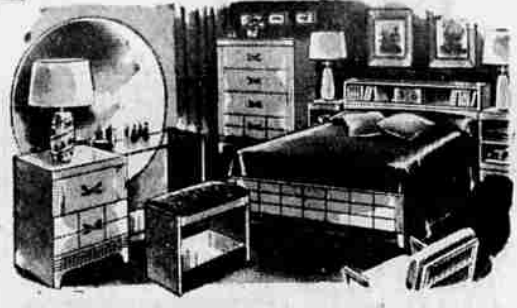
