Two Dead In Gun Battle

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP)— A gun battle early Wednesday left one city policeman and a gunman dead and another officer "hanging onto life by a thread."

Police Chief Paul Shaver said Patrolman Frank A. Sjolander, 27, was killed and Patrolman Eugene F. Casey, 30, critically wounded by four slugs while investigating a disturbance in front of a residential area apartment.

Shaver initially identified the dead gunman as Jim Sparr, also known as Jim Blake, about 25, who Shaver said apparently was a parole violator from California.

Police sent out an alarm for Sparr's companion, whose identity wasn't known, but who Shaver said apparently engaged in the battle. Shaver said the companion also apparently was a California parole violator.

Two Albuquerque men were held on an open charge. Shaver said they apparently witnessed the shooting.

The chief pieced together this account of what happened:

The two Californians and the two local men drove to the apartment early Wednesday. The Californians left the car and were creating a disturbance in front.

Youth Discovers Parents' Bodies

DRUMMOND, Mont. (AP)— A Drummond schoolboy walked into his ranch home about a mile east of this Western Montana community after school Tuesday and found both his parents shot to death.

Dead were Arthur E. Periman, about 48, and his wife, Lorna, about 38.

Coroner R. R. Wilson and Sheriff Fritz Lueck said the tragedy was "apparent murder-suicide" but reserved final judgment pending further investigation.

The bodies of the ranch couple were found by their son, Lawrence, in an upstairs bedroom, each with a bullet hole between the eyes. Wilson said it appeared Periman shot his wife and then turned a .30-30 Carbine on himself.

Death Claims Veteran Newsman

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)— Funeral services will be held here Thursday for Ray W. Taylor, 85, veteran California newsman who died Monday night.

Taylor was born in India where his father was a British Army officer. Coming to the United States in 1879, he worked on most of the major San Francisco papers. After his retirement in 1929 he wrote magazine articles.

Survivors include a sister, Winifred Wilson of Coquille, Ore.
