Crash Injures Three Motorists

A car-truck accident Tuesday evening sent three motorists to the Klamath Valley Hospital for medical attention. The accident occurred a short distance north of the summit of the Spring Creek hill on Highway 97 north of Chiloquin.

The driver of the transport truck, owned by the Los Angeles - Seattle Motor Express Company, Dennis Welsey Roberts of Seattle, told officers he was traveling south when he noticed the car approaching swerving from side to side. Before he could bring the truck to a stop the car crashed almost head-on into the big diesel.

Driver of the car, Bill Visalli, Boise, and two passengers, Doris Joseph Wymer and Elbert Harrison, both of Saquel, California, were taken to the hospital. Wymer was treated and released, but Visalli and Harrison are still under a physician's care. Neither is considered seriously injured. The driver of the truck was not injured.

According to state police the car was loaded with cages of Parakeets which were broken open in the crash. Many of the birds, escaped, officers stated.

ROCKETS

CHICAGO (AP)—A former German army rocket expert says rocket-propelled airplanes can be built in the next 10 or 15 years with speeds up to 13,000 miles an hour. Dr. Walter R. Dornberger, missile specialist for Bell Aircraft Corp., said such aircraft could flash from San Francisco to Australia in 1½ hours.

Progress Of Turkey Cited

ESKISEHIR, Turkey (AP)—Prime Minister Adnan Menderes says Turkey will overcome current shortages and become a land of plenty in two or three years.

Four sugar refineries have been built in the last two years and four more are under construction, Menderes reported, with the result recent sugar shortages should not happen again. He believes Turkey will be a sugar exporter by 1956.

The Prime Minister cited these other developments: Seven of Turkey's ports are being reconstructed. Seven great dams are being built and various power plants are being erected. Irrigation works are also being advanced and soon "no village or district will lack water or electricity."

New processing plants for meat, fish, wheat, macaroni and canned goods are being constructed.

Youths And Girl Given Sentences

CHICAGO (AP)—Two youths and a girl were sentenced in Criminal Court yesterday to prison terms totaling 317 years for killing an 83-year-old man June 25.

Pablo Delgado, 20, was sentenced to 199 years; Victor Camacho, 15, to 190 years; and Miss Emily Shouse, 16, to 18 years.

They were convicted after pleading guilty to a charge of murdering Joseph Gruner in an attempted robbery of a restaurant.

Red Chinese Warn Allies

MOSCOW (AP)—Red China told the Russian-sponsored European Security Conference Wednesday if the United States and its allies go to war against the Communist countries "they will suffer a fate worse than Hitler's."

Red China's ambassador to Moscow, Chang Wen-Tien, sitting as an observer, told the third session of the conference the 600 million people of Red China stand "shoulder to shoulder" with the Soviet Union.

He said Russia had become more powerful than ever before in history.

Chang is also a member of the central committee of the Chinese Communist Party and a leader of its politburo.

The Chinese ambassador's remarks followed a call by Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) Washington for a United States air and sea blockade of the Red China mainland.

AIRDROP

WASHINGTON (AP)—An airdrop of U.S. aid supplies in northern Laos is under way, according to reports received by the Foreign Operations Administration. The reports indicated the supplies are going to soldiers and civilians either released or escaped from Communist forces in the recent Indochina fighting.

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
