1954 Kiwanis, 4-H Potato King Bruce Haskins Explains Farm Methods Use

Drive east of Klamath Falls four miles past Dairy, turn north and drive to the first farmhouse on the left. There, on a ranch which contrasts the work of nature and the work of man, wild grazing land runs between fragrant junipers to the right; to the left fertile fields bare their cultivated countenances. And there, too, lies one acre of farm land on which King Bruce Haskins raised the 1954 championship crop of 4-H Club potatoes.

On a trek to the other side of Olney map, the Herald and News staff photographer, Don Kettler, and this reporter learned potatoes from the ground up—literally—in an afternoon with the king. We flipped back the mental calendar to April 15, when the 10-year-old potato plant started his record book for the 4-H Club project. The young farmer rented an acre of irrigable land with a clay base for \$65 (not prepaid). Like most juniors, the project became a family affair at the very offset, and "pop" was prevailed upon to finance 30 sacks of Netted Gem foundation seed from Wilford Dixon at Macdoel. Cost, which had to be repaid, was \$35. Very soon in his career Bruce

learned that it pays to pay more for quality. Dad is in the middle of a procedure through which, if all tests prove successful, his seed will be eligible for foundation tags, making the seed sell for about \$1 more per sack than commercial seed. Bruce could take advantage of this testing program on his own acre of potatoes.

Chronologically in the season, Bruce helped either manually or morally in the many processes toward ultimate harvest—planting, cultivating, irrigating, etc. He observed inspections for disease, and watched while readings were taken to warrant spraying and dusting for aphids (at a cost of about 60 per acre); saw Oregon State College field men check behind the digger for diseased potatoes; learned that samples from the field will be sent to the OSC greenhouse, planted and records kept for foundation tag eligibility.

Before digging, Bruce's potatoes were roto-beaten, or as he explained to us laymen, the vines were beaten off with a machine to facilitate digging and picking. Incidentally, our king played it smart—he picked potatoes for his dad and not paid for it. "Course, in the long run, we aren't sure he saved."

Charles (Bud) Short, inspector for the State Department of Agriculture; Francis Skinner, county 4-H Club agent and others were on hand at harvest time to compute his average field yield and percentage of No. 1s on the basis of 10 sacks taken from various points.

Since we were strictly novices at this business, Bruce explained that No. 1s are smooth, larger than 1 1/2 inches in diameter, not green, chipped or skinned—"well, they're almost perfect!" he finished.

Bruce sold his No. 1s to dad for \$1.50 per sack after expenses. In case readers feel an urge to return to the soil, his expenses for the year were \$301.84; income was \$532.62, making a net profit of \$230.78. Profits are destined for a steer which also will be a 4-H Club project. Additional funds for the purchase will come from sale of eggs, since Bruce has charge of the ranch chickens and gets proceeds from eggs. But herein lies another tale!

The young king, enterprising as he is, traded Granddad Luther Haskins 12 fryers for a lamb last year, which was to have been a 4-H project. A late start squelched hopes; the lamb was slaughtered and Bruce gave up 4-H hopes temporarily.

Diversified interests range from 4-H to a butterfly collection to James Fenimore Cooper tales to hunting, fishing, swimming and still there's time to ride Babe, his favorite saddle horse.

It was while royalty rode high on a horse that the young king exhibited a marked display of wit. Photographer Kettler grinned and commented, "Oh, is that a horse?"

'54 Earnings, Plans Told In California Mine News

YREKA — Approximately \$312,000 worth of gold and silver bullion was shipped to the U. S. Mint in San Francisco this year from the Siskion mine and mill near Happy Camp. The mine and mill have been in operation six and one-half months.

This figure was estimated and reported to its stockholders by the Siskion Corporation and represents

the period from March 23, 1954 to October 1, 1954.

The corporation's first consideration is to increase ore reserves and next to increase the daily capacity of the mill, according to the report.

Development work has been carried on during the summer months and still is in progress, the report stated.

"We have, at Siskion, an area known as 'Billy's Mine,'" the report says, "which is a mineralized zone not yet properly explored, which probably contains a large body of copper ore."

"Exploration work on this body of ore will start next year and also in the copper ore zone is the Gray Eagle Mine, which the corporation leased, with an option to buy, last July."

During World War II, this mine produced and milled approximately 465,000 tons of copper ore for another company. It is stated, but acquisition of the mine was spurred because gold deposits were found there. The gold may be mined by a power shovel the report explained.

No plans have been made to start operations at the mine at the present time, it was stated. "Our search for a uranium property of merit has not been crowned as yet with an appreciable degree of success," the report said. "However, interest in three drilling permits have been acquired, and several properties are being considered at the present time."

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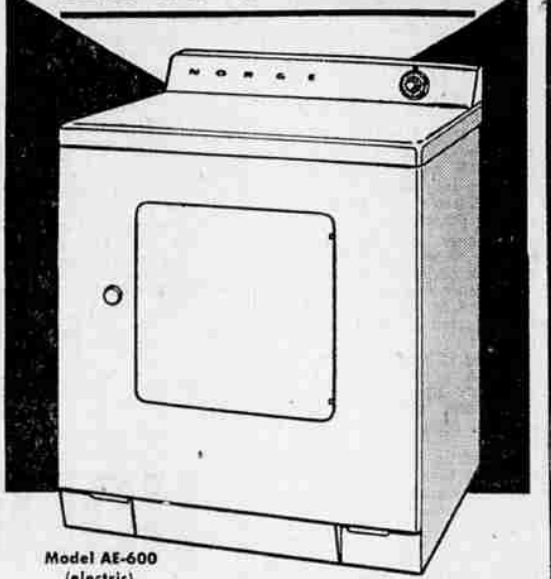
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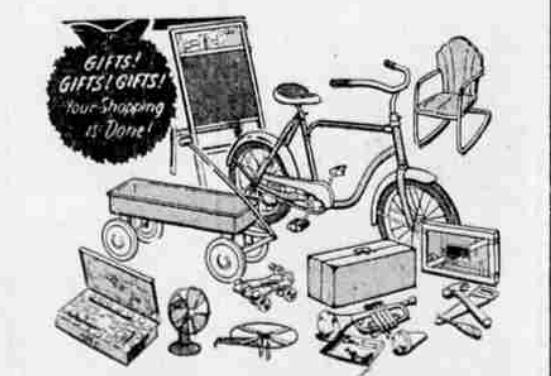
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
