Oregon Corn Awards Won

WOODBURN — Oscar McCarty of Echo, who averaged 192 bushels of corn per acre on his Umatilla County farm, Saturday won the sweepstakes award at the annual State Corn Show.

It was the second highest yield in the 13-year history of the show, topped only by the 205-bushel set last year by Rennie Larson of Hermiston.

McCarty grew 16 hybrid varieties.

James Webber, Canby, was the 4-H Club winner with 123 bushels from an irrigated field. John Thiel, Adrian, was the FFA winner with 151 bushels from an irrigated field.

Larry Faust, Canby, was the Western Oregon irrigated field winner with 143 bushels. He was a regional winner last year, and

RCAF Flier Freed From Red Prison

HONG KONG — Squadron Leader Andrew R. (Andy) MacKenzie, a Canadian flier shot down in the Korean War and just freed from imprisonment in Red China, says the Chinese are still holding some American war prisoners in his prison camp.

The 34-year-old air ace reported upon reaching Hong Kong yesterday that the Americans he knows about—all Air Force fliers—had been allowed to write home and it was known in the United States that they were prisoners.

He said they do not include any of the 13 Americans recently sentenced by Peking on spy charges.

Canadian and U. S. officials did not permit disclosure here of the number or names of the captured men. The location of the camp also was withheld.

In Washington, an Air Force casualty officer said three Americans were known to have been in the camp with MacKenzie. They were Capt. Harold E. Fischer, Swea City, Iowa; Lt. Lyle W. Cameron, Lincoln, Neb.; and Lt. Roland W. Parks, Omaha, Neb.

MacKenzie reached freedom two years to the day after he was shot down near the Yalu River in North Korea while flying as an exchange officer with the U. S. Air Force.

Canadian diplomats had asked about him when they met the Chinese Communist delegation at the Geneva conference last June on Korea and Indochina. The Reds promised at that time to release him.

Appearing thin but otherwise healthy, he arrived in the custody of three Red Chinese guards. He wore a blue, padded Chinese uniform.
