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Rain, Sleet Covers Plains

More rain, snow and sleet pelted wide areas from the Northern Plains to the Appalachians Thursday and colder weather headed in to the Midwest.

One snow belt extended from central Michigan southwestward through sections of Illinois, into northeastern Missouri and northward through central Iowa into Minnesota. Light snow also fell across the Northern Plains and extended from Canada to the Gulf and from the Mississippi River eastward to the Ap-

palachians. Showers and sleet were reported across the mountains into central Pennsylvania and Virginia. Falls in most places were light with heaviest amounts measuring around two inches. Only other wet area was the Pacific Coast from San Francisco northward which reported light to moderate rain. Outside the snow belt temperatures generally were in the 40s and 50s with a few 60s along the Gulf. It was near zero in Big Piney, Wyo., one of the coldest spots.

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
